



<u>\$21,338 to Great Plains Food Bank:</u> The Mission Committee sends great thanks to all who contributed in November in response to the special appeal for funds for the Great Plains Food Bank. Together, the Fargo and Baker-Downer congregations raised more than triple the amount that the Mission Committee set as a matching challenge from its Emerging Needs budget.

With \$16,338 in individual donations and \$5,000 from Mission's Emerging Needs match, First Presbyterian has sent a total of \$21,338 to the food bank, for distribution to food pantries across all of North Dakota's counties, plus Clay County in Minnesota.

The needs continue, and donations through the church will still be accepted and relayed to the food bank. Donations by check should be designated on the memo line with the word "Food"; gifts can be made online at www.firstpresfargo.org/give, and make sure to select the "Great Plains Food Bank" fund.

Christmas Joy Offering: The Christmas Joy Offering helps support retired church workers and families who are now in financial crisis, and emerging church leaders like students in schools and colleges equipping communities of color to bring their gifts of service to the world.
