Mission Collection for the Summer: For the next few months, we are collecting sunscreen and mosquito spray to be given to local agencies to handout to those without shelter, particularly for families with children and for those living by the river. The Banner for Ordinary Time includes symbols from our Lord's parable of the sower demonstrating the theme of Christian growth. A withered bush testifies to the seed which fell on thorny soil and did not grow. The seed which fell on good soil matured and produced fruit as seen in the mature wheat at the bottom of the banner. The banner is crafted in shades of green to symbolize the growth of Christians as they walked their road of discipleship, faces pointed always toward the triumph of the cross.
