5. How is marriage a drama of the gospel? Why is viewing that drama important to the children who are born into it?
6. How did the curse of Eve create an ongoing temptation for the wife in marriage?
7. How does Abigail handle her role as a wife to Nabal? Does she fall to the temptation of Eve?
