I hope and pray it would be similar to the message to the church in Philadelphia:

I know your works. Behold, I have set before you an open door, which no one is able to shut. I know that you have but little power, and yet you have kept my word and have not denied my name.

Revelation 3:8

The open door Jesus speaks of is likely an <u>open door for the</u> gospel and for mission! This is my personal prayer, that Jesus would open such a door for us that no one could shut, a door for His good news to radiate through us as a church! Let's pray for this to become our reality!

The truth is we are all <u>empowered</u> for God's global mission, even though the part we might play may be different to another. What greater confirmation is there than the words of Jesus Himself:

All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the father and of the son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold I am with you always, to the end of the age.

It is not for you to know this times or seasons that the father has fixed by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.


Acts 1:8

Thank you, WIC, for your prayers, the impact of which can never be underestimated. We also appreciate your financial support and words of encouragement.

The world continues to be confusing. A year ago, did we expect to see another war break out in Europe? Two years ago, we were celebrating the easing of COVID lockdown restrictions, little knowing what was still to come. Are we now living in post COVID? With new cases averaging nearly 10,000 per day? There is still so much uncertainty around the world, but what we can be certain of is that God is with us. He is equipping and empowering us to be his hands and feet where we live here in Sydney, and wherever else we serve.

We are continually amazed by our in-country partners and staff as they serve people who are feeling like there is less and less hope for the future. Some governments are exercising more and more control over their people and organisations seeking to help those marginalised and in need. But with God's strength we lean in and serve in Him. We reach into the community through practical helps which open doors for spiritual impact.

In India a woman experienced God's physical healing where no medical treatment or prayers from her village temple had any impact. She was prayed for by our team and God healed her. She accepted Jesus as Lord but was thrown out of the village for this. Our team, and this woman, continued to seek God's protection and guidance and she is now an important part of the women's ministry in that part of the country.

What's ahead?

- We're praying and planning a reconnection trip to India in November
- Many children need sponsors, especially in India
- A group of women are waiting to join the next tailoring school in India
- A lunch will be held in the Upperroom on Sunday 11th September sharing really encouraging and uplifting stories and launching a new program for youth in China.

- A return to short team mission teams
- Resources to provide more training, safe water and education for our H4K communities
- More people will see Jesus and be touched by the ministry of Heart for Kids and will turn to Jesus.

But at the same time, our student numbers are at record levels even though we have had to be creative in presenting our lessons. We have restarted our outstation work with several outreaches just completed. We have also embarked on a significant feeding program reaching hundreds of families. We are praying these efforts will bring many to Christ.

PNG

Our work in PNG continues through those we have trained who have risen to meet the many challenges, including widespread COVID, civil unrest increasing poverty. We are so proud of the efforts our students have made to address the subject of child abuse. September will be our first trip back to PNG to bring encouragement and blessing to our graduates.

Not being able to travel due to COVID has allowed us to do a major re-write of our training material. And our curriculum on HOPE, written to address some of the problems children face, has been widely accepted and used.

In order for Christians to be empowered for missions, they need more than head knowledge in such things as church planting strategies or cross cultural intelligence. The McKellehers serve with OMF among the marginalized in Taipei. Edna works with older women in the red light district and Will with prisoners and those affected by drug & alcohol addiction.

Some phenomenal news is the Taiwanese government will be implementing nation wide initiatives to support women who want to leave the sex trade! To date the police arrest or fine women caught in prostitution. The police are now expected to refer women who would like further support onto social services or employment services.

This past year we have also been walking closer with Taiwanese Christians seriously considering overseas mission work. It is encouraging to witness their passion for Christ & decision to serve Him cross culturally.

Over the years we testify that any transformation in individual lives, community or a nation is only possible through the powerful work of the Holy Spirit. We hope you will heed God's call to share the gospel in this world full of hurt and turmoil.

Please pray for:

- The government to successfully engage the Police, Employment Services & Social Services to implement holistic support that will benefit many women and their families.
- Edna to deliver a clear & impactful training session for social workers from social services around the island on 8 Aug.
- God will raise up churches and Christian NGOs to establish centres like the Pearl Family Garden (where Edna serves) around the country.

- Will regularly follows up with Eric and Chao who have addiction issues. Pray they would be willing to seek help and for the Holy Spirit to break these chains of addiction.
- We are thankful for our son Joshua who loves God.
 Pray for him as he begins Grade 11 in August and sits for the SAT exam (American final English & Math exam).

Our team's focus is training and equipping those who work with Tibetan Buddhists. The workers we equip are expats from all over the world, non-Tibetan Buddhist background Christian nationals in India and Nepal, as well as Tibetan Buddhist background Christians themselves. We equip these workers by offering conferences and training workshops (including song writing workshops), supporting translation projects, mentoring young believers, as well as developing and distributing resources. Our team also develops prayer materials to help believers around the world pray for Tibetan Buddhists.

The Tibetans are an unreached people group that live in the Himalayan region. Their religion, Tibetan Buddhism, is strongly tied to their culture and many of them have never heard the gospel. There are many different Tibetan groups and dialects spread across India, Nepal, China, Bhutan, Mongolia and Russia. They commonly enjoy eating yak meat and momos (dumplings) as well as a staple called "tsampa" made from grains. Their meals are often washed down with yak butter tea served with a good pinch of salt. Tibetans love folk dancing and singing.

Please pray that:

- we will learn Thai quickly. Although we don't minister in Thai, we want Thai language skills so that we can live here comfortably.
- our girls Kensie and Savannah will be built up in their resilience as they adjust to life in Thailand.
- our marriage will be strong and that we will lean on each other for support during these times.
- all four in our family will grow in our love and understanding of the Lord and that each of us will walk closely with him.
- our team will work together well. We are a multicultural team from a variety of Christian organisations.
- God will continue his good work among Tibetan Buddhists across Central Asia. Pray that many of them will come to faith.
- God will strengthen Tibetan Buddhist background Christians. Pray that they will grow in unity, in love for God and for each other, and in their understanding of God's Word.

For many, the thought of missions can be scary, but we have learnt and seen that with the Holy Spirit working in and through each of us it is possible. God uses each of us in different ways, but all of us are called to mission. This is how we are involved.

As Ministry Leader for OMF International for NSW/ACT, Sarah meets with people exploring missions, liaises with churches, supports missionaries and is part of the national leadership team. As Jesus began his earthly ministry, Jesus empowered by the Holy Spirit, reiterated Isaiah's words aloud in the synagogue. He opened the scroll and declared to everyone in the synagogue what God had called him to do. To "proclaim good news to the poor, freedom for the prisoners, and sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free," and "to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor" (Isaiah 61:1-2). These words in Isaiah have been our mission mandate in northeastern Thailand, known as the Isan region. Over the last ten years, we can be thankful for God's empowerment and leading as Sunshine Foundation was able to share the good news to the poor, giving hope and freedom to many orphans, neglected children and elderlies. We had the opportunity to help over a dozen children in fulfilling their dreams of escaping poverty, and bring joy and hope to many elderlies who have come to know God personally.

We are thankful for all of God's provision and leading, the church. Sunshine Fellowship we established is maturing and growing. We have seen God move, as the local leadership empowered by the Holy Spirit, gather momentum and courage in stepping out in faith. One particular distinct event, was when they stepped out in faith, praying for an elderly who couldn't walk, bedridden for years from a motorbike accident. Many have never on their own seen a healing prayer answered, while some who only had the privilege while in our presence saw God miracles move in seeing happen before their eyes.

However, at this particular moment, we were nowhere present due to COVID lockdown restrictions.

With no Pastor to turn to, they, empowered by the Holy Spirit, prayed in faith for healing. The result of their faith miracle. sparked accepting Christ to receiving a faith-filled prayer of healing, this crippled elderly was able to regain his strength and by faith started walking again. Today if you see him, he wears a glowing smile, as he walks to church each Sunday and testifies God's goodness in his life. In June, I had the privilege of baptising him, and believe that God will use him mighty.

As thankful as I am in seeing the leadership exercise all that we have been teaching, I am furthermore thankful, that the Church has embraced the vision to church plant in the next district of Na Wang, and with much urgency wanting to establish the plant.

Continue to keep us in your prayers, as we want more of Jesus and less of us. We want to make sure when we step out to plant, that we are not running ahead of God in His plans.

As COVID continues to bring many disruptions and immobilise many of our programs, please pray as we slowly re-establish all our programs.
