## Power, authority, and Jesus: Understanding marriage through the love of Jesus Ephesians 5:22-33

The radical reorientation of the Christian life is let go of the ways of the world and <u>conform</u> to the ways of Jesus

Men and women are <u>equally</u> made in God's image, but they were created to <u>compliment</u> one another in their relationship and responsibilities.

Following the way of Jesus is <u>fundamentally</u> different from the way of the world.

Each of these relationships involve the concepts of <u>authority</u> and <u>submission</u>.

Following Jesus requires that we reorient our understanding of authority and submission around the <u>relationship</u> between Jesus and the <u>church</u>.

Jesus loves those who are His all the way to the end.

Jesus presents those who are His as holy and blameless in the end.

The goals of Christ-like authority are:

- 1. The benefit of those under your care and oversight
- 2. <u>Present</u> those under your leadership as holy and blameless in the end.
- 3. Love and sacrifice for others in the same way you would care for yourself.

The power and responsibility of authority are rightly understood through <u>Jesus</u>.

The <u>symbol</u> of power and authority in the church is the cross of Christ.

The marriage relationship exists with the <u>cross</u> at the center.

The cross defines the goals of Christian relationships, especially marriage:

- 1. Holiness and purity
- 2. Humility and unity
- 3. Sanctification and Satisfaction

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
