## Article XII. Education

Christianity is the faith of enlightenment and intelligence. In Jesus Christ abide all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. All sound learning is, therefore, a part of our Christian heritage. The new birth opens all human faculties and creates a thirst for knowledge. Moreover, the cause of education in the Kingdom of Christ is co-ordinate with the causes of missions and general benevolence, and should receive along with these the liberal support of the churches. An adequate system of Christian education is necessary to a complete spiritual program for Christ's people.

In Christian education there should be a proper balance between academic freedom and academic responsibility. Freedom in any orderly relationship of human life is always limited and never absolute. The freedom of a teacher in a Christian school, college, or seminary is limited by the pre-eminence of Jesus Christ, by the authoritative nature of the Scriptures, and by the distinct purpose for which the school exists.

- 1. Sin suppresses the truth
- 2. Salvation births a new hunger that requires new food.
- 3. New <u>Christians</u> become more <u>mature</u> Christians Hebrews 5:12–6:2 (CSB)

An adequate system of Christian education is necessary to a complete spiritual program for Christ's people.

<u>Discipleship</u> (Education and Equipping) is <u>necessary</u> for the accomplishment of the mission of the church.

Discipleship (Education and Equipping) is <u>necessary</u> for a believer to live <u>pleasing</u> to God.

- 1. Churches are the <u>primary</u> means for Christian education. Ephesians 4:11–15 (CSB)
- 2. <u>Pastors</u> must be able to educate and equip people to do ministry. 2 Timothy 2:1–2 (CSB)
- 3. The church should have a <u>comprehensive</u> and <u>relevant</u> ministry for educating and equipping members of the church.
- 4. A healthy system or ministry educates and equips members to know God, share the gospel, and live <u>faithful</u> to the Lord.
- 5. An adequate system or ministry educates and equips new <u>believers</u> all the way to <u>pastors</u> and <u>missionaries</u>.
