## You **were** dead

Being dead in trespasses and sins means to be <u>blind</u> to the truth of Jesus and <u>deaf</u> to the Holy Spirit and <u>unmoved</u> by the Word.

"Dead in our trespasses and sins" describes the human condition and its way of life:

- 1. <u>Enslaved</u> to your sin nature and under the dominion of the Devil.
- 2. Following the course of the world
- 3. Following the <u>prince</u> of the power of the air
- 4. Driven and motivated by the <u>flesh</u>
- 5. Doing what you selfishly desire

God doesn't merely cast a life preserver for <u>sinking</u> souls to grasp. Instead, He takes those who have already <u>drowned</u> in the depths of the sea and breathes new <u>life</u> into them.

What motivates God's saving grace?
God acts on our behalf because of his mercy, love, kindness, and glory.

Salvation is more than forgiveness.

Salvation equals <u>life</u>.

Our works don't save us, but our works are evidence that God has made us alive with Christ.

"<sup>14</sup> What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? <sup>15</sup> If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, <sup>16</sup> and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled," without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that? <sup>17</sup> So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead." - James 2:14-17
