Tolerance places friendship and worldly reputation over faithfulness to God.

The greatest evidence of worldliness in the church is the ease by which we point out the sins some and dismiss the sins of our friends. James 2:1, Romans 12:1-3

Idolatry is the root of homosexuality and transgenderism, because it's at the root of all sin. Romans 1:16–32

Idolatry is an exchange of worship and service of God to self. Romans 1:25

Homosexuality is idolatry that denies the truth and rejects God's authority. Leviticus 18:22, 1 Corinthians 6:9–10

Christians find their identity in Christ, not our sin. Romans 6:8-14

Christians are people who turned from idols to serve the living and true God 1 Thessalonians 1:9–10

Christians continually repent from their sins as seek to live in the grace and freedom of God. Colossians 3:5–11

"Repentance is killing that which is killing me without killing myself." - Tim Keller

So, what about the fact that Jesus said, "Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone?" John 8:1–11
