## 1 Peter 2:13–17 (ESV)

<sup>13</sup> Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether it be to the emperor as supreme, <sup>14</sup> or to governors as sent by him to punish those who do evil and to praise those who do good. <sup>15</sup> For this is the will of God, that by doing good you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish people. <sup>16</sup> Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a coverup for evil, but living as servants of God. <sup>17</sup> Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the emperor.

Your relationship with God determines the <u>nature</u> of your relationship with everyone else.

Your actions flow from your <u>identity</u>, or, your <u>identity</u> determines your lifestyle.

- 1. Your relationship with authorities is a <u>reflection</u> on the ultimate authority.
- 2. Your relationship with <u>difficult</u> leaders and authorities <u>demonstrates</u> the truth of the gospel
- 3. Citizenship in God's kingdom is not the same thing as diplomatic immunity
- 4. Your relationship with God determines the nature of your relationship with others.

3 ways to live for the glory of God in the current political chaos:

- 1. Pray for those in leadership.
- 2. Be <u>informed</u>, equipped, and <u>engaged</u>. "Politics is too important to be left to the politicians."
- 2. Be informed, equipped, and engaged.

"Its actually more important that you are able to <u>process</u> and think about the <u>issues</u> of our day through a <u>Christian</u> (or Biblical) worldview."

3. <u>Serve</u> others and <u>share</u> the gospel

Your relationship with God determines the nature of your relationship with everyone else.
