## Redeemer: The God who saves is the God who sends. Exodus 3-4

The book of Exodus begins at a time when Israel had lost sight of who God is.

God does more than give his name, God reveals His <u>nature</u> and <u>character</u> to Moses.

<u>Yahweh</u> is the one true God who has always <u>been</u>, always will <u>be</u>, and <u>caused</u> all things to be.

God <u>commissions</u> Moses to deliver His message to Pharaoh and to Israel.

God's redemption of Israel from Egypt is <u>foundational</u> to our understanding of the <u>gospel</u> of Jesus Christ.

- 1. Jesus is the <u>fulfillment</u> of God's covenant promise to Abraham.
- 2. Jesus came down to deliver His people from slavery to sin.
- 3. Jesus <u>commissions</u> every Christian to take the gospel message to their neighbors and the nations.

Who do we tell them sent us? <u>Jesus</u>, the one who is, who was, who caused all things to be, and who is to come.

Repentance is the path toward revival and reaching the lost.

The revived church prioritizes <u>reaching</u> the <u>lost</u>.

You're right about all of your weaknesses, but Jesus has promised to be with you!

God is still the God who saves and the God who sends.
