Redeemer: God's purpose for redemption is the foundation for the mission of your life.

Exodus 40:34-38

God redeemed Israel from Egypt so they would know Him and make Him known.

God's purpose for <u>redemption</u> was the foundation for understanding the <u>mission</u> of Israel on earth.

- 1. Knowing God begins with God making Himself known.
- 2. Knowing God requires <u>reconciliation</u> and <u>repentance</u>.
- 3. Knowing God results in the willful obedience to His plans and purposes.

"Moses was not able to enter the tent of meeting because the cloud settled on it, and the glory of the Lord filled the tabernacle." Exodus 40:35

<u>Jesus</u> is the complete fulfillment of God's purpose.

The torn veil symbolized that what was lost in the garden and foreshadowed in the tabernacle and temple is fully realized in Jesus Christ.

Jesus came so that we would know God and make Him known.

"And this is eternal life, that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent." John 17:3

- 1. Knowing God begins with believing in Jesus Christ as He is revealed in the Bible.
- 2. Knowing God requires <u>reconciliation</u> with God by faith grace through faith and <u>repentance</u> from sin.
- 3. Knowing God results in the <u>willful</u> obedience to Jesus and His <u>mission</u>.

God sends Christians out to nations with the <u>presence</u> and <u>power</u> of the Holy Spirit.

Following Jesus occupies <u>the entire life</u> of a Christian. Why? Because God's purpose is for all of your life.

God redeems us through Christ so that we would know Him and make Him known with our entire lives.
