The Good and Gracious Shepherd 1 Peter 5:1-11

Jesus is the good and gracious shepherd

Jesus loves and rescues his sheep from the grip of sin and death

Jesus <u>leads</u> his sheep

Jesus <u>feeds</u> his sheep

Jesus <u>tends</u> his sheep

The good and gracious shepherd <u>suffered</u> for the glory of God, and <u>so will</u> his sheep.

As Christ followers we must <u>humble</u> ourselves and <u>stand firm</u> in our faith.

God gives elders/pastors to be the <u>under-shepherds</u> of his church.

- 1. Elder, pastor, and overseer are used throughout the NT to refer to the <u>same office</u> in the church.
- 2. Elders serve willingly, humbly, and for the inheritance of Christ
- 3. Elders <u>exercise oversight</u> of the flock by leading, feeding, training the sheep, and tending the sheep.

Elders love the sheep

Elders <u>lead</u> the flock

Elders <u>feed</u> the sheep

Elders train and equip the flock

Elders <u>tend</u> to the sheep

Elders lead as a <u>plurality</u>

The church glorifies the Good Shepherd

The church guards the gospel

The church grows in maturity, on mission, and through multiplication.

Jesus is the good and gracious shepherd
