Christians should be against slavery, especially the Christians who are free.

## Following Jesus requires a radical reorientation of what is good, right, and true

"Therefore do not become partners with them; <sup>8</sup> for at one time you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light <sup>9</sup> (for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true), <sup>10</sup> and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord." - Ephesians 5:7-10

The radical reorientation of the Christian life is let go of the ways of the world and <u>conform</u> to the ways of Jesus

Following Jesus radically reorients the "why" and "how" of our relationships with others.

- 1. Why? We do what we do for others <u>because</u> of our relationship with <u>Jesus</u>.
- 2. How? Christians <u>treat</u> others the way they wish was done for <u>them</u>.

The radical reorientation of the Christian life is let go of the ways of the world and conform to <u>servant-hearted</u> way of Jesus

Following Jesus means a radical reorientation away from the worldliness of <u>partiality</u>; and toward the humble, <u>genuine</u>, servant-hearted, willing, and <u>impartial</u> way of Jesus.

Radical reorientation to relationships that is <u>Christ</u>-centered and <u>others</u> focused.

- 1. You can't keep score of who serves you- that is the opposite of what you should be doing.
- 2. You can't do things for others hoping they will praise <u>you</u> for what you have done- that's the opposite of what you should be doing.

Following Jesus requires a radical reorientation from <u>pleasing men</u> to <u>pleasing Christ</u>

Four ways that you can live and work for the opinion and praise of others:

- **1.** Be <u>hypocritical</u>, insincere, and <u>selfishly</u> focused on what you <u>think</u> or how you <u>feel</u>. Ephesians 6:5
- **2.** Selfishly focused on what people can <u>see</u> so they think better of you than you <u>deserve</u>. Ephesians 6:6
- **3.** Reluctant and <u>selfishly</u> focused on the reward of their <u>praise</u> and opinion. Ephesians 6:7-8
- **4.** Selfishly using your position or <u>influence</u> to benefit <u>you</u> at the expense of <u>others</u>. Ephesians 6:9

Four ways you can live and work for the <u>name</u> and praise of <u>Jesus Christ</u>:

1. Be genuine and pure in your motives toward others as if you are doing it for Jesus.

Ephesians 6:5

2. Be unconcerned about your <u>personal</u> reputation because you are consumed with living for the reputation of <u>Jesus Christ</u>.

Ephesians 6:6-7

- **3.** Working and living to the best of your <u>ability</u> for the reward that waits for you in <u>heaven</u>. Ephesians 6:7-8
- **4.** Serving and sacrificing for Jesus; for the benefit of <u>others</u> at <u>personal</u> expense. Ephesians 6:9

Following Jesus requires that we regularly look inwardly at our <u>own</u> hearts and respond with <u>faith</u>, <u>repentance</u>, and <u>obedience</u>.
