



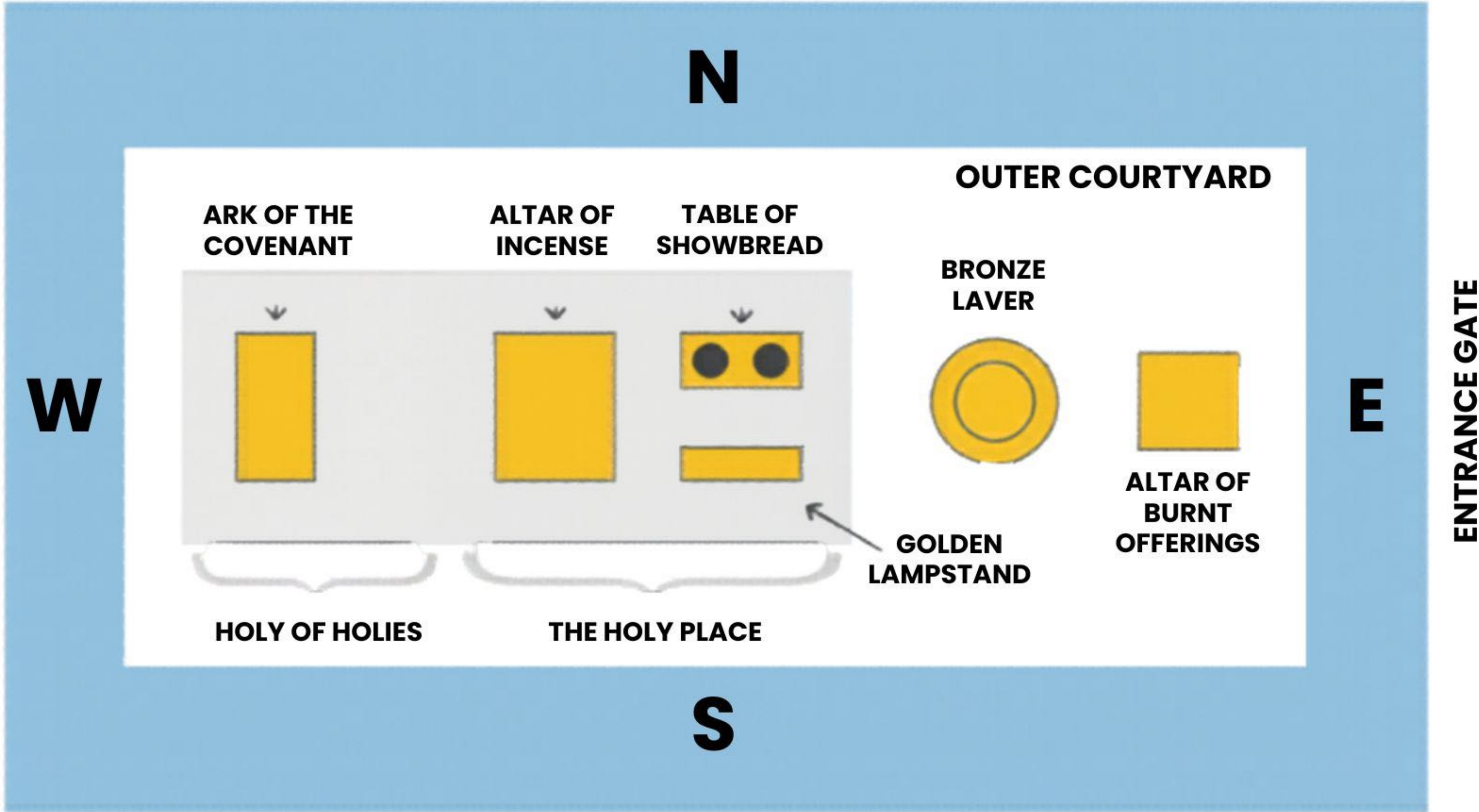

The Tabernacle of Moses (Exodus 35-40)



Q1: What is the tabernacle?

The Tabernacle was a portable, mobile building.

Exodus 25:8: “Have them make a sanctuary for me, and I will dwell among them.”



Exodus 31: 1-3

“Then the Lord said to Moses, 2 “See, I have chosen Bezalel son of Uri, the son of Hur, of the tribe of Judah, 3 and I have filled him with the Spirit of God, with wisdom, with understanding, with knowledge and with all kinds of skills— 4 to make artistic designs for work in gold, silver and bronze, 5 to cut and set stones, to work in wood, and to engage in all kinds of crafts.”

The Tabernacle

The tabernacle is basically a tent like structure made of **curtains and frames.**

Covers the entire tabernacle. God is a God of great detail and intricacy.

Thirteen chapters of the final sixteen deals with the tabernacle.







Q2: What's Inside the Tabernacle?

The tabernacle was 150 feet by 75 feet for the **courtyard**. Think half the size of a football stadium.

The **tent structure** was a long, narrow shipping container or think long mobile home.

Within the tabernacle was called the **Holy of Holies**. A 15 foot by fifteen -foot space. Think of a small bedroom.

Q2: What's Inside the Tabernacle?

Holy of Holies contained the ark of the covenant and 10 commandments (the law of Moses).

The **Ark of the covenant** was a gold pated wooden chest built to keep the 10 commandments. Ark was also called Ark of the testimony. Ark is the container and the 10 commandments were stone tablets. Ten laws engraved on stone.



Q2: What's Inside the Tabernacle?

- Atonement cover
- Curtain
- Table
- Lampstands
- Altar of incense
- Anointing oil.
- Altar of Burnt offering
- Basin







The trumpets and the shofar were
blown as the tabernacle moved.

Q3: Does the Tabernacle represent Jesus?

Mistake # 1: Trying to make all things in the Tab about Jesus.

Mistake #: Saying that nothing in the Tabernacle is about Jesus.

God is with us. His presence is with us.

and commune with Him.**

Q4: What is the role of the OT HIGH PRIEST?

“7 But only the high priest entered the inner room, and that only once a year, and never without blood, which he offered for himself and for the sins the people had committed in ignorance.” (Hebrews 9:7)

Q5: Is Jesus the fulfillment of the OT covenant?

“11 But when Christ came as high priest of the good things that are now already here,[a] he went through the greater and more perfect tabernacle that is not made with human hands, that is to say, is not a part of this creation. 12 He did not enter by means of the blood of goats and calves; but he entered the Most Holy Place once for all by his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption.”

(Hebrews 9:11-12)

Takeaway #1 - The tabernacle foreshadows the person of Yeshua (Jesus)

- He tabernacles among us (John 1:14)
- Yeshua is the golden lampstand and the bread of life.
- He is the light of the world.

Takeaway # 2- Yeshua (Jesus) is our high priest who welcomes us into the presence of God.

“Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. 15 For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin. 16 Let us then approach God’s throne of grace with confidence...” (Hebrews 4:14-16)

Takeaway # 3- We are the tabernacle. Spirit comes to live inside of us.

- Make some space for God.
- We were created for intimacy with God.



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
