




Safety and Security Team Ministry 2023 Annual Report

In October 2023, the ministry was formed with the purpose of further growing a safe, disturbance free environment for ministry and fellowship within all LNPC facilities and LNPC activities.

Stephen Moorehead was identified as the lead who will serve as the primary decision maker for safety and security related matters. He was charged to form and train a team who can evaluate safety and security requirements, implement effective strategies, make recommendations for improvements, and foster a safe and secure LNPC campus.

In 2024, the ministry will build upon an incumbent team that includes Craig Baker, Scott Troester, Greg Johnson, Steve Galloway, Tony Abraham, John Flannery, Fred Ehlers, Tom Dunn, and Tom Stocksdale. This team has already been performing their duties in an exemplary manner during the worship service on Sunday.

The ministry has coordinated with the Laguna Niguel Police Department and the Orange County Intelligence Assessment Center to perform an initial risk assessment of LNPC facilities. This assessment will assist the ministry in identifying and prioritizing key vulnerabilities, no-to-low cost improvements, team training, and updating requisite plans and policies.

The Communications Ministry Team in 2023 has continued to work on the flow of information from the individual ministry teams in planning and promoting events.

In 2023 LNPC was open and active with no restrictions on being together due to COVID. Folks that are concerned for their health or the health of others at risk wear masks when needed. We have seen our membership decline since COVID; some have decided to leave the church or take a break. LNPC now has three ways to do church. On Sundays, we have folks that come to



sing hymns, worship, and be together in the Sanctuary. There are some that choose to sit outside and watch worship on a screen. And there are members who prefer to worship remotely and join with us on Sunday using Facebook live.

The adult and youth volunteers were led by our Associate Pastor Anette Rihovsky, and everyone enjoyed their time together.

Pastor Anette left LNPC shortly after to pursue a pastoral call and John Denton, our youth pastor, was called to be head pastor for a church south of us. In September we welcomed Pastor Sara McCurdy as our associate.

In August we participated in the Sea Country Festival for the first time. Sponsored by the Laguna Niguel Parks & Recreation, we decorated our new LNPC pop-up booth staffed by church volunteers & Pastor Jim for the three-day event. Our group provided fresh popcorn, scripture, games, and a video of pictures from church activities and music from past Christmas Worship Festivals. The Sea Country Festival featured many booths with different themes, foods, carnival rides and games. The plan is to put up our booth in 2024.

It was decided in the summer of 2023 that our church website needed an update or makeover. We were fortunate that there was a member of our congregation with the skills to create a new website. Ben Roebuck, a young man, and college student that had grown up at LNPC, was already on board as a tech for our Sunday worship services. Ben was hired to help us select a new website and to transition over to the new format. Chuck Griswold, our previous webmaster, is to be celebrated for creating our first website and for maintaining that website for many years. SNAPSHOT OF A WONDERFUL YEAR!

The Missions Team had a successful year supporting our adopted projects. With your support, we were able to support the following:

Military Support - LNPC again partnered with the Laguna Niguel Military Support Committee which supports three units, including 1/4 of Camp Pendleton. We collected enough toys to give out to 134 kids at Christmas. It is our honor to continue supporting our Military Families.

Friendship Shelter of Laguna Beach - The lovely "Bag Ladies" of LNPCcontinued to meet monthly preparing approximately 60 full sandwich meals to this shelter. Great fellowship and devotion goes into this project. We are so happy that some of our youth help with bag decorations and preparations.

Plant with Purpose - We hope to bring education and awareness to LNPC on how to bring environmental restoration, economic empowerment and spiritual renewal. Thanks go out to Susie and Carl Hess who organized a wonderful Bible study centered around this project.

FAM - This partnership with Family Assistance Ministries has been overwhelmingly successful. We are averaging approximately 65 families weekly at our LNPC food satellite. Not only do clients receive healthy food options, a case manager is on site each week offering other helpful resources. Every holiday a special treat is given out to clients with a "God Loves You" gift bag.

South County Outreach - The SCO food barrels can be found in Gard Hall. This year, we prepared Thanksgiving bags with traditional food items and gift cards. Several food drives were done with much success.



With your help and generosity, we continued to support the Presbyterian Mission Agency and Disaster Assistance. The Holy Yoga program has been well attended and donations collected have all gone to support the Missions Projects.






