Celebrating HOPE in Worship

Scripture: Matthew 15:1-9; James 4:8

Summary: Humans were created to worship. People will give honor and praise to someone or something somewhere sometime. A person can worship self or another person. One can worship an organization or an inanimate object like an idol. Worship is an action in which one offers something of value to another. The wise men brought gifts to worship the messiah (Matthew 2:11). Abraham brought Issac to worship God on Mount Moriah (Genesis 22:1-18). The Israelites sacrificed a lamb to worship God during the Passover (Exodus 12:13-27). That act of worship was to both ask and thank God for the death angel passing over the house. Bowing figuratively and literally is an act of worship. Singing is an act of worship. Giving offerings is an act of worship. Praying is an act of worship. Worship is an action in which one offers something of value to another with the desire and intent to give honor and praise. Worship actions include thanksgiving for blessings received. But also to include the hope of connecting. Also the hope of receiving. Worship is not passive. Worship is active. Worship is celebrating the hope found in one who creates, leads and saves!

We worship when we give our deepest affections and highest praise to something. True worship of God is when we love Him with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength. It's when we prize God above everything else and put Him first in our hearts and in our lives. (Love Worth Finding)

[8] "This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me;[9] in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men."

VAIN: conceited, narcissistic, self-loving, in love with oneself, self-absorbed, self-centered, egotistical, proud, haughty, arrogant, boastful, literary vainglorious, have an excessively high opinion of oneself

- We must honor God with our lips and our hearts.
- We must worship God as a doctrine and commandment from Him.
- Worship God because of who He is, what He has done and has promised to do!
