Sermon Summary

In Luke 14, Jesus clearly identifies the Cost of Discipleship saying, "So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14:33). Jesus renounced everything he had to be sent to earth. "Though Jesus was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9). Jesus sends his disciples to do what he did, the way he did it! "As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you (John 20:21). In Luke 14, Jesus points to a banquet for the poor, crippled, blind and lame telling his disciples to invite such people. The purpose of the Church is to Reach the Lost and Make Disciples! Jesus' teaching in Luke 14 and His parables in Luke 15 shed light on His disciples living sent every day in unique situations to specific people. Are you living sent?

The Lost Coin: Light a Lamp Luke 15:8-10

Luke 15 has been called "The Gospel in the Gospel."

Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear him. And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them." So he told them this parable: Luke 15:1-3


Life Application Questions
