Sermon Summary

There is a pride of man that exists in our American culture that suffocates the glory of God. This pride manifests itself in new ways all the time. It is persistent and persuasive. Any time man tries to deviate from God's created order or to subvert God's plan, his prideful attempt is usurping glory due God! Paul understood and wanted to make sure the Ephesians and all who would read this letter would understand not only the mystery of the Gospel but that every ounce of Glory goes to God. Not even a small amount for the believer and none for the church. There is a temptation that can come with salvation that might result in self glory. Every believer must pray and seek to live in a consistent state of giving glory to God and to God alone. What happens in the life of the believer and the body of Christ, the church, should give glory to God like Christ Jesus did both now and forever! Jesus is our example. He emptied Himself becoming obedient even to death on the cross. The Lord raised Him on the third day and He was glorified in the resurrection by the power of God. The death of Jesus appeared to be the end. The disciples certainly thought so. Even though Jesus prepared them for His resurrection, they did not fully understand. God is always able to do more than we think or imagine. The same God who raised Jesus on the third day is the Lord of our lives and the church. His power has not diminished. His authority has not been reduced. His plan has not been thwarted. His return is imminent. He reigns from on high. He will come for His own. He will judge those who reject His love. He will condemn those who do not believe in His Son. He will punish the prideful who do not live for His glory and His alone! He will commend those who lived in obedience to Him, glorifying Him and who as servants and stewards of His mysteries remained faithful to Him! (1 Corinthians 4:1-5)

Scripture Overview: ALL the GLORY goes to GOD Himself! He is the only one who is able to save. He is the only one who can work grace and mercy to cover sin by the blood of Jesus. He is the only one who can accomplish this work and any other thing that we would ask or could think. Paul nailed the matter for all time as he concluded this prayer. Here at the end of Chapter Three, where the conclusion of all that God has done for mankind in the person of Jesus comes to an amazing crescendo, Paul offers his highest commendation of praise. Only God is able. Only God does His mighty work within each believer. Only God accomplishes anything of value or worth and He deserves the praise and glory both now and forever and ever through every generation! Amen.

Scripture: **Ephesians 3:20-21 (NLT**) 20 Now all glory to God, who is able, through his mighty power at work within us, to accomplish infinitely more than we might ask or think. 21 Glory to him in the church and in Christ Jesus through all generations forever and ever! Amen.
