












#### Acts 16;11-40 and Philippians Overview

March 13, 2020

From the days of the Caesars to the democratic states of our own day, and especially to the Marxist empires, the ungodly have seen that biblical Christianity creates a rival government to the humanistic state. When a person is saved, they are members of a new creation and God's kingdom, and they are to be a working member of that realm. They understand that the state is not the ultimate authority, but it is God who is the ultimate authority. Godless humanistic states do not like the idea that they will have to answer to someone other than themselves. So, when a rival view of reality, a rival understanding of life and government are brought to people's attention, the humanistic state takes notice and tries to squash the new threat.

We see this demonstrated throughout history as God's kingdom has advanced, it has met resistance from godless, wicked governments. We saw this in Soviet Russia, we see it in North Korea, we see it even now as totalitarians begin to enforce new restrictions on religious freedoms (Canadian truckers). The kingdom of light will always collide with the kingdom of darkness. **The faithful preaching of the word of God and the witness of the faithful Christians will always cause conflict with a humanistic world and state**. We see this very thing demonstrated in the founding of the church at Philippi.

#### The Founding of the Church Acts 16:11-40

Paul's normal custom was to go to the synagogue of the city and begin to minister there. Philippi did not have one. It took Jewish males to start a synagogue. They heard there was a place by the river where the Godfearing people met together to pray on the Sabbath. It was there they met their first convert, a woman named Lydia who was dealer of purple goods. She had means and invited them to stay at her house. It is assumed that the church began meeting at her house after that.

Philippi was a Roman colony and was a leading city in the district of Macedonia. When Rome would conquer an area, they would set up colonies like Philippi to teach and promote the Roman way of life. Because of this, Roman influence was strong in the city. Many retired generals settled there and most considered themselves to be Roman not Macedonian or Philippian. **Even in this hostile environment, God planted His church**.

As Paul and Silas were going about their ministry in the city, a slave girl with a demon followed them proclaiming that these men are proclaiming the "way of salvation". After many days of this Paul turned and exercised the demon out of her. When the slave girl's owners saw that they were no longer going to make money from her, they dragged them before the magistrates. The charge they made against them was that they were Jews, and they were advocating customs that were unlawful for Romans to accept or practice. Paul was addressing the fact that they worshiped false God's and their need to turn from false worship to worship of the true and living God.

What was the result of their preaching of the Gospel? They took a beating, literally. They were beat and then thrown in jail for the night. While they were in prison, Paul and Silas were singing hymns to the Lord. All at once there was an earthquake and the gates were opened and the jailer was about to kill himself, when Paul stopped him and let him know that they were all still there. No one had tried to escape. If a prisoner escaped, then the person in charge of the prisoner would be executed. This whole situation was obviously not something the jailer had seen before, so he was open to the Gospel. Paul shared the message of salvation and the jailer's whole family was saved and baptized.

When the magistrates were made aware that Paul and Silas were Roman citizens, they were greatly alarmed, for it was illegal for them to beat a Roman citizen without a trial. So, they tried to just get rid of them quietly. Paul would have none of that and made them come and remove them from the jail personally. The magistrates did so and asked them to leave the city quietly. So, they went back to Lydia and the rest of the church and then went on their way. Then they went to Thessalonica and declared Jesus to be Lord there as well and another riot broke out.

Why talk about all of this when we are starting to study the book of Philippians? It is important for us to understand what the circumstances were when the church was founded and the reason that the letter was written in the first place. Historical understandings really help us to understand the significance of what was written. Obviously, starting a riot, and getting thrown into jail was probably not on Paul's to do list. But that is what God used to birth the church. The claim of Jesus confronts people at the core of who they are. **People cannot remain neutral when they are faced with Jesus**. He even said, "You are either for me or against me." His call is a call to come and die and live for Christ.

Ten years after Paul's initial contact with the church, Paul is writing to them to thank them for sending provisions for him while he was in prison again. Paul is in prison in Rome, this time, during the reign of Caesar Nero. The church found out that Paul was in prison and sent Epaphroditus with provisions to care for Paul's needs (2:25-29; 4:10-20). Prison in Rome was not like prison in our society. You either had friends and family to take care of you or it was even more miserable than it already was. So Epaphroditus made the 800-mile trip from Philippi to Rome. This trip would take 39-52 days to complete. While Epaphroditus was in Rome he took care of Paul. While he was there, he almost died. So, Paul's purpose in writing the letter was to say "thank you" for sending Epaphroditus and to reassure the church that he had recovered and was doing much better. Some scholars think that Paul had Epaphroditus deliver the letter to the Philippian church.

The major theme of the book is the Gospel of Jesus Christ. He commends them for "defending and confirming the Gospel" (1:7), "to advance the Gospel" (1:12), and "the defense of the Gospel" (1:16). He thanks them for their "partnership in the Gospel" (1:5) since the early days for their "acquaintance with the Gospel" (4:15). His first and most important application point is that the Philippians would "live as citizens in a worthy manner of the Gospel of Christ, ... striving together with one accord for the faith of the Gospel" (1:27). The biggest praise that Paul gives to the church is that they "served with me in the work of the Gospel" and "contended at my side in the cause of the Gospel" (2:22, 4:3). The Gospel of Jesus Christ takes first place in Paul's mission and in his letter.

The content of his Gospel message is that Jesus Christ is Lord. The letter is filled with the praise of Jesus. Jesus is the perfect picture of the Gospel being lived out in His obedience, even though being God he lived as a human being in perfect obedience to the Father, to the point of death, even death on the cross. Consequently, God exalted Him by giving Him the name "Lord" so that all creation will worship Him as the sovereign above all earthly sovereigns. Declaring that every knee will bow, and tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord (2:5-11).

This Gospel of Christ has special relevance for this church in a Roman colony. To stand firm against the gospel of Caesar, they needed to worship Jesus Christ as the Lord and Savior above all earthly powers. No matter what earthly powers stand against them, all Christians everywhere are called to "live in a manner worthy of the Gospel."

Things weren't much different in Paul's day as it is in ours. The war between good and evil still rages on. The Kingdom of God is still advancing in our generation. The church still being called to be a faithful witness even in the face of growing intolerance of the message we preach. As we study the book of

Philippians, I want us to remember that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. The Holy Spirit that indwelt Paul, Silas, and the Philippian church is the same Holy Spirit that fills us today.

Just like Paul did not shrink back in the face of opposition, we are not to shrink back either. Paul's mission in life was to see Jesus Christ exalted in his generation, that should be our goal as His church as well. We have a Savior that is worthy of our worship and praise, and He is worthy of suffering for as well. I pray that we will have a new appreciation for the Gospel and for proclaiming it as we study this letter to the Philippian church.


