



To Live is Christ Pastor Matt Harder

Philippians 1:18-26 April 3, 2022

Vs. 18b-20 Paul is rejoicing that the Gospel is being proclaimed. He is not concerned with the motives of those who are preaching, only that the Gospel message is going out. It is through the prayers of the believers and the help of the Spirit of Christ that this situation will turn out for Paul's deliverance. Paul's use of the term deliverance is similar to Job 13:13-18, where Job declares that even if the Lord slays him, he will trust in the Lord. So, the term deliverance can be understood in two different ways. One way is that it is Paul looking forward to spiritual deliverance, meaning that if he is executed, he will be delivered into the presence of the Lord in heaven. It has also been understood to mean that Paul will be delivered in a physical sense. This understanding is one where Paul will be released from prison and will not see the executioner at this time but will continue with the ministry the Lord has for him. Either way we look at it, Paul's expectation is that Jesus will be honored, and that Paul will be delivered either physically or eternally. Ultimately, we need to understand that **the Lord will take care of His own**. It might not always turn out exactly like we want it to, but God takes care of the righteous. Romans 8:28.

That is instructive for us. Not many of us are expecting to die any time soon, but there are times and situations in life where death might seem better than facing our current situation. Paul is in one of those times in his life. He is sitting in prison; it was not experiencing the good things in life. But he recognized that he there on behalf of the Lord. If the Lord chose to physically rescue him and release him from prison, the Lord would be honored. If the Lord chooses to allow Paul to executed, the Lord would be honored. Paul's concern is not for his own wellbeing, but that of the Lord's reputation. Often, we are looking out for our own comfort, reputation, or wellbeing rather than being concerned for our Lord's reputation. Paul's desire for himself is that he will not be ashamed, but that the Lord will give him courage to be outspoken, and to be bold in speech when he faces his trial. If he should die, he would have courage in death as well. Whether in life or in death, Chris is honored. Paul's real joy is that Christ is proclaimed no matter what happened to him. This reminds me of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego (Daniel 3:13-18).

Vs 21 **For Paul to live is Christ and die is gain**. What does that mean? The Greek can be translated several ways here. There is no verb in the Greek, so it actually translates "to live-Christ" It can be translated, as it is, "to live is Christ", or "to live honors Christ", "to live means Christ", "to live depends on Christ", you get the picture. The foundation, center, purpose, direction, power, and meaning of Paul's life is Christ. Here is a man whose singular focus in life is to see Christ exalted. He does not care about his own reputation, he does not care about the trouble he is in, or the consequences of that trouble. He is a living illustration of what Christ meant when he said, "Take up you cross and follow Me, and if you're unwilling to do that, you're not worthy to be my disciple." Paul was a man who was willing to bear the cross. He did not care what happened to him, what people said about him, or whether he lived or died. This level of commitment is one that we do not see much in our generation. We live in a materialistic, self-centered day, a self-serving day, not a self-sacrificing day. People today live for a lot of things, but not many live for Christ.

Death is gain. The word gain means something advantageous or profitable. Paul recognizes that in death he will be in the presence of Jesus. That is far more profitable than being in jail. In death all the trouble, the suffering, the pain, the hardship that he is enduring will be over with and he will get to be with Christ. That is far more profitable than any earthly treasure can buy.

When you think about it, it is only the Christian that can gain from death. The atheist believes they will cease to exist, that they have no soul, that once they are dead that is it. Secular humanism falls into this category as well. If there is nothing after life, what is the point of living? Therefore, the suicide rate is so high. The government schools have taught that we are just cosmic star dust, and our lives don't matter. Is it any wonder that young people are hopeless? The Muslim believes is in a place called paradise and hell. But they need good works to

get there, and once they die, they are dependent on Ala's favor towards them as to which place they go. There is no guarantee. The Hindu believes is reincarnation. If they are good, they will get a better life when they come back. If they are bad, they will get a worse life. All they while hoping they will reach a state of nirvana, where they will achieve peace and no more suffering. If they fail to achieve nirvana, they are immediately born into another body to try again. Faith in Jesus' for salvation is the only way one can hope to gain when they die. Asking a person what they believe will happen to them after they die is a great way to open the door to sharing the Gospel.

Vs 22-23 We see the struggle that Paul has. He knows that if he lives, it means fruitful labor for the Lord. But if he dies, then he is in the presence of the Lord. His desire is to depart and to be with Jesus. Here we get a real sense for Paul's heart. Either way, Paul will have joy. Joy does not come about by his circumstances. **Paul's joy is found in the firm foundation of Jesus Christ**. When he is in prison and the Gospel is proclaimed by those who are doing so with right motives, Paul rejoices. When others preach the Gospel to undermine Paul's ministry, he rejoices. If Paul lives, he gets to continue laboring for Jesus, Paul rejoices. If he dies, he gets to be in the presence of the Lord, Paul rejoices. Paul's hope was in Jesus. Paul's life was in Jesus. He could not be shaken. This is instructive for us. Many times, our hope is in other things than Jesus and when we lose those things, we lose our joy. This should not be the case for the believer. Our joy should be unshakable. That does not mean that we do not have emotions about things we are going through. But our circumstances and emotions do not determine our joy. We have joy despite the hard things we go through in life, because our Lord has taken care of our biggest need of all. He died in our place. He saved us from hell. How can we not be filled with joy? Paul knew that he could trust Jesus and Jesus would see him through whatever situation he was in and that was worth rejoicing over.

You can as well. **Jesus is worth trusting**. He is who He said He was. He is our Savior. He promised salvation to those who repent and believe. He is not a liar. He can be trusted. Do you trust Him? I know many of you have trusted Him for your eternal salvation, but you struggle to trust Him for your day-to-day provisions. You struggle to trust Him with your hurts and heart aches. If you can trust Him for your eternal salvation, shouldn't you be able to trust Him with the comparatively small stuff of life? If you don't trust Him with the small stuff of life, do you really trust Him for your salvation?

Vs 24-26 **Paul's focus is on others**. Paul has two strong desires. One desire is to depart and be with Jesus. The second desire is to stay and help build the church. Even though Paul would rather be home with the Lord, he recognizes that is better if he remains so that he can continue to serve these believers. He looks forward to remaining with them to see them progress and grow in Christ. Paul did not see his work for the Lord as being burdensome. It was a joy for Paul to do the work of the Lord. Seeing people's lives changed by Christ was such a joy for Paul that was truly perplexing for Paul as to which he would rather do. Would he rather die and be with Christ or would rather continue to serve Christ in this life and see the fruit of his labor in souls saved for Christ? If he lives, he gets to help the church grow, he gets to see lives transformed, and the Lord will receive the glory that is due Him. Others will benefit from his staying.

So what? Paul's life was totally committed to Jesus Christ. Because Paul was committed to Jesus, his goal in life was to make Him known. As Paul and the early church made Jesus known, they changed the world around them. The early church called this the "third race," the church was Christ's new society. The church declared and lived a new way of life, and consequently manifested a new culture; it cannot help but do so. This means that everything in our lives expresses the totality of the reign and purposes of God. We must recognize, like the early church, that Jesus Christ is still Lord and so by the Holy Spirit, faithfulness to Him in sharing the Gospel and obeying His commands will make new creations out of people, gathering a new race who build new cultures. This is not by revolution, but by regeneration, faithfulness, and obedience.




