### **Scripture**

Luke 22:31-32

- Satan wants to stop the plan for our life. (2 Corinthians 2:11) Where in your life does the enemy try to sift you?
- Be aware of his plan and be dead to the flesh. Know all that we need is what comes from heaven.
  - Receiving the life that was intended for you requires a renewing of the mind.
- It is our faith that will get us through all. Our faith can not fail.

~ Being just; being justified. ~

Proverbs 21:15, Psalm 106:3, Proverbs 21:3, Galatians 2:16

- We have to put our faith in Jesus Christ. We are not justified by the works of the law, it is by our faith that we are justified. If justification only comes from the law, no one will be justified.
  - Our righteousness is as filthy rags and we would be condemned if based on our own righteousness (Isaiah 64:6).

Matthew 12:37

- Our words will justify us or condemn us. What we say is a representation of our heart poster.

1 John 1:9

- If we confess our sins, He is just and will cleanse us. Confess before you are condemned (humble yourself before you get humbled).

Romans 10:9-10

- Guilty of sin without a doubt, but you have been cleansed and forgiven by your confession that Jesus is our Lord and savior and that He has risen.
  - The renewing of the mind comes from the faith in what Jesus has done. He has come to save, not to condemn. That was his mission. Have faith that his mission has been fulfilled and that it is our faith in him that has made us justified.

1 John 2:6

- Do you say that you live in God? If so, your life should be a reflection of how Jesus lived.
- I know I have been saved, so I should be living and abiding in the Lord.

Luke 18:1-9

- We “[...] should always pray and never give up.” Gather your faith and surround yourself with people that also have faith and justice will be given.

Proverbs 24:17-18

- When we’ve been wronged, we should not wish ill will on your enemy. If you do, God turns his anger away from them and towards you.
  - We cannot forget the example that Jesus served for us. He asked for forgiveness for those that persecuted him

When you enter the presence of the Lord, you come as you are and you leave changed. He comes to bring about change, healing, restoration, etc.
