Fulfilling Your God-Given Purpose

Purpose is the "why" behind our existence - the reason God created mankind and each individual it's rooted in God's eternal plan and doesn't change.

Isaiah 43:7 (NKJV)

- God doesn't leave room for interpretation. He made you for a purpose and that purpose is to glorify Him.
- Jesus saying "It is done" was Him declaring his fulfillment of God's purpose for His life.

~ Purpose is determined by God. ~

Psalm 138:8 (AMP)

• God has given us all a purpose. He will see to it that we accomplish that purpose.

Ephesians 5:11 (AMP)

- God has given us a purpose and destiny to fulfill.
- No person was made by accident. God has something that He wants done so He created each and every person. There is no mistake.

Jeremiah 1:5 (AMP)

• Before we were even born, God has approved us fit to fulfill our purpose while here on earth.

~ Calling is rooted in purpose. ~

Calling is the "how" we live out that purpose. The specific assignment, role, task and path God sets before us.

Ephesians 4:1 (ESV)

- God is in control of everything, we just have to let Him "take the wheel". Calling makes our purpose personalized. It's how we actively carry out our eternal purpose.
- We have been called to a holy life and set us apart to live for him and impact others.

2 Timothy 1:9 (AMP)

Our purpose in life through God, is the purpose of God through life.

Our purpose in God is to glorify Him, that never changes. Through life (everything we do
in throughout our day) needs to be done in a way that glorifies Him

Ephesians 2:10 (ESV)

- The life we live is to be lived to fulfill our purpose through God. To do that, you need to know your purpose.
- There are certain things He wants to have done, and He has an assignment for everyone to accomplish that. He has called us to our calling even before we knew what our calling was.
 - ~ Calling must be discovered, not invented. ~

You have to know what gifts (tools for your falling) you have been given so that you can use them within your calling. Your call

Gifts mean: The Spiritual abilities God gives each believer to serve Him and others assignments, roles, tasks or paths God sets before us.

- 1 Corinthians 12:4,7 (NLT), Romans 12:6-8 (NLT)
 - Gifts have been given so that we can live out our calling to fulfill God's purpose.

The purpose will always remain the same. Our calling can change in different seasons, but it always worlds towards fulfilling the purpose of glorifying God.

Psalm 32:8 (NIV)

• God will teach us, instruct us in what we need to do.

Galatians 6:4 (AMP)

- You will never find our calling while coveting.
- We do not need to compare ourselves to others. We are not to try and imitate others when we see them living out their calling. We miss out on our own calling because we are trying to walk in a calling that wasn't meant for us.

Proverbs 19:21 (AMP)

- You cannot know your calling outside of the person that wrote the "script". When you discover
 your calling, you stop looking after things that are not filling. Instead, you continue to seek the
 next task God has called you to do.
 - ~ Calling is revealed through relationships with God. ~

Calling being revealed comes through surrendering to God's will. He will give you the strength, and wisdom to live it out.

Philippians 2:13 (AMP)

- You must have a genuine relationship with God before your calling can be revealed.
- Pray, worship, and quiet reflection provides clarity and direction from the Lord as you build relationships.

James 5:8 (NKJV), Psalm 25:14 (AMP), Jeremiah 33:3 (NKJV)

- To truly know your calling and discern God's will, you must keep your eyes on the King and allow him to transform our mind.
- This allows us to shift our thinking from the world to godly thinking.

Romans 12:2 (AMP), Proverbs 3:5 (NLT)

- Calling requires preparation and trust in God's timing.
- Every relationship requires trust. In our walk, the truth usually grows in the soil of difficulty. Not to destroy us, but to prepare us and strengthen us.

1 Timothy 4:7-8 (NLT), James 1:2-4 (NIV), 2 Timothy 3:16

- Preparation is the training ground where God equips us with patience, resilience, humility and faith.
- We must be refined before stepping into the callings that God has planned for us. Without this, we will not be capable of bearing the weight of our calling.
 - The refining process may feel like abandonment, but it is not.
 - God uses the refining process to shape our character, deepen our faith and prepare us for the greater assignment ahead.

Proverbs 16:4, Romans 8:28 (AMP)

• Trials are not waisted. God uses trials to position us to our destiny. He already has the design, we just have to trust Him and count it all joy knowing that it is for the fulfillment of our calling.

~ Walking in purpose and fulfillment daily. ~

When someone only lives for themselves, it doesn't matter how much we obtain, there is no true fulfillment. This is because their lives were never aligned with God's plan for them; they never fulfilled their actual purpose.

Acts 16:31 (NIV), 1 Corinthians 4:2 (NIV), John 15:4 (NIV), Matthew 32:37 (NIV), John 15:12 (NIV), James 1:22 (NIV)

• Don't be just hearers of the word, be a doer. Be faithful in the smaller things so that, in His timing, God will reveal to you.

Deuteronomy 29:29 (NIV)

- Intentionally quiet the noise of the world so that God's spirit can align with yours so that His will
 may be revealed to you.
