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
## **Definitions - What is Science?**

**Oxford Languages Definition**: the systematic study of the structure and behavior of the physical and natural world through observation, experimentation, and the testing of theories against the evidence obtained


Possible Broader Definition: a systematized body of knowledge





## The Scientific Method: Problem of Induction




## The Problem of Induction

- Inductive reasoning alone is unable to prove anything without a priori assumptions
- \* ...not only our reason fails us in the discovery of the ultimate connection of causes and effects, but even after experience has informed us of their constant conjunction, it is impossible for us to satisfy ourselves by our reason, why we should extend that experience beyond those particular instances, which have fallen under our observation."

## The Scientific Method: Philosophical Assumptions



## Nature is ordered and uniform

- Natural laws apply in all places
- Natural laws apply at all times
- Nature has a rational order

#### Nature exists and is real

What we experience has true existence

#### Nature is discoverable

- Human senses are reliable
- The human mind can comprehend nature

Christian theism provides the only foundation for these assumptions by asserting that God created rational man in his image with the faculties to understand his creation that he upholds and governs

- Recognition of the importance and value of non-clerical work and an active life

- Interpreting creation on its own terms, instead of as an puzzle for obscured truth





# Models of Science and Religion: Scientism




# Models of Science and Religion: Dichotomy

# **Christian Foundations: Summary**
