## Digging Deeper: John 14:1–14 - Son to the Father

**Day 1:** Today, read John 14: 1–14 all at once. Our focus today is on Jesus and His Father. Spend time in prayer about Jesus, our Lord and King, and the Father. What observations can you make? Does anything surprise you?

**Day 2:** Read John 14:1–3 today. It is not uncommon to hear these verses quoted at a funeral. Today, consider the implications of these verses and our own death. How do these verses bring peace and comfort to the Christian?

**Day 3:** Read John 14:4–6 today. We speak of the "way" and the narrow path towards salvation. Here Jesus specifically says that there is one way to the Father. What is it? Also, read Matthew 7:13–14. The way Jesus described is narrow and few find it. Spend some time praying about what our Lord is saying to us about the "way."

**Day 4:** Read John 14:7–10. Jesus says that "if you had seen me you would have seen the Father." Think of the magnitude of this statement! Absolutely amazing! Today, stop what you are doing and pray about this. The entire Bible is about Jesus our Lord; therefore, in every chapter and on every page we learn about the Father.

**Day 5:** Read John 14:11–14. Today our focus is on works. This is an amazing statement that Jesus makes: "Even greater works will you do." Research what these works are—as this answer really unlocks understanding the focus of our lives as disciples of Christ.

**Day 6:** Read John 14:1–14. Today, spend time summarizing the week and preparing for the Lord's Day. Consider the billions of people on our planet blinded by "religion" and attempting to work their way to God. Think about these passages and how we know and come to God the Father. Today, in your journal write the Gospel of grace and pray about the infinite mercy and love of God and his desire to know us and save us as sinners to become new creations (2 Corinthians 5:17).
