Digging Deeper: John 6:16-24 - Jesus Walks on Water

Day 1

Read all of John 6:16-24, and pray that you will understand what God is teaching us.

- What happened that evening before the disciples went to the boat. See John 6:10.
- Verse 16 begins with His disciples going down to the shore to wait for Him. Why did Jesus not go with them?

Day 2

- Why do the disciples get into the boat to cross over after feeding the 5,000. See verses 16–17 and Matthew 14:22.
- Why did Jesus withdraw to the mountain by himself? Read Matthew 14:23 and Mark 6:46. What can we learn from Jesus when He goes off by himself like this?

Day 3

Describe the situation that the disciples find themselves in during the night? Read John 6:18 and Matthew 14:24.

- · Who do you think is responsible for them being in this situation?
- Do you ever find yourself jumping in the boat and not waiting on the Captain?
- · What can we learn from this?

Day 4

Read verses 19–21.

- Does the sight of Jesus calm the fears of the disciples? See Mark 6:49 and Matthew 14:26.
- · Jesus says the them, "Don't be afraid, I am here!

Day 5

Given the way Jesus uses the phrase, "I Am," elsewhere in the Gospel of John, what might Jesus be trying to tell them beyond identifying Himself? See John 8:58, Exodus 3:14 and Job 9:8.

Day 6

There is a sequel to Jesus walking on the water found in Psalm 107:23-31.

• How can we apply the events of these stories to the situations that we find ourselves?

To Ponder:

- 1. Have you ever been in a situation when you thought you were in real danger of drowning?
- 2. If you like boating, how do you feel when the waves get choppy and the winds start to howl?
