

Bible Study: Filled With Worship



Text: Isaiah 9:6

Series: A Season to Remember

OPENING THOUGHT - Advent invites us to pause in a world marked by noise, hurry, and heaviness. It calls us to remember that Jesus—born in humility yet fully God—entered darkness to bring hope, peace, and restoration. Isaiah’s prophecy announces not a sentimental Christmas image but a Saviour whose very name calls us to worship.

ADVENT BEGINS WITH WORSHIP (Isaiah 9:6)

Isaiah writes during days of fear, uncertainty, and impending invasion. Into this atmosphere, God declares:

“**For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given...**” Advent pulls us away from worry and back into worship.

THREE PRACTICES THAT FILL ADVENT WITH WORSHIP

1. Worship Begins with Wonder - “**His name shall be called Wonderful.**”

Advent calls us to slow down so we can behold the beauty of Christ again.

Daily Practice: I. Read a portion of the Christmas story. II. Sit quietly with the Holy Spirit. III. Worship with a single song.

2. Worship Requires Listening – “**His name shall be called Counsellor.**”

Advent invites us to unclutter our minds and listen to Jesus, who is the Truth.

Reflection: Ask: “Lord, what are You saying to me this season?”

3. Worship Anchors Our Hope

Mighty God — He is strong enough.

Everlasting Father — He holds all things.

Prince of Peace — He restores what sin ruined.

APPLICATION QUESTIONS

1. Where do you sense the Holy Spirit inviting you to slow down and rediscover wonder this season?

2. What voices or distractions do you need to silence in order to hear Jesus more clearly?

3. Which title of Jesus speaks most to your current situation—Wonderful, Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, or Prince of Peace?

4. Where is worry competing with worship in your life right now?

5. Is there a relationship or situation where God is calling you to be a peacemaker? What might obedience look like?

CLOSING ENCOURAGEMENT - May this season become one you remember not for what you accomplished, but for how deeply you worshiped. Let every part of this Advent—your wonder, your listening, your hope—lead you to the feet of the One who is Wonderful, Mighty, Eternal, and the Prince of Peace.
