Consider giving up your chewing habit or switching to an eco-friendly alternative.	23 Community Attend a Green Team meeting and get involved in caring for God's Creation.

Choose the glass option next time!	27 Buy Fresh Buy fresh bread that's wrapped in paper, instead of bread that is pre-packaged in plastic.	²⁸ Invest in Quality Minimize the demand for cheap items that will have a shorter shelf life and invest in quality materials.	²⁹ Stream Don't buy new CDs, DVDs, or games. Instead stream as much as possible.	30 Connect with environmental mission partners like Urban Trekkers or Neighborhood Collaborative Community Gardens.
