Puppet Review Script

NOTE: If you have a Lion Puppet from the Lesson 109 Hands-On Activity, put it over Puppet Two as his lion disguise. Otherwise, just make him act sneaky.

Puppet One: Hi, everyone! It's time for you to review your lessons, right?

Teacher or Students: Yes, it is! Where is (Puppet Two)?

Puppet Two: (sneaks in pretending to be a lion)

Puppet One: Oh, he's around here somewhere (giggles).

Puppet Two: (jumps out and roars) Rooooaar!

Teacher: (acting scared) Oh no! There's a ferocious lion in here! Shoo!

Puppet One: Ha ha! He scared you!

Teacher: What? Who is that? (takes disguise off Puppet Two) Oh, it's (Puppet Two)! There you are.

Puppet Two: Did I make a good lion?

Teacher: You certainly did! And did you know we talked about lions in one of our lessons?

Puppet Two: What? No way!

Puppet One: Tell us about it.

Teacher: Well, it's actually very exciting. You see, Daniel was a man who loved God and obeyed him.

Puppet One: I've heard of him. Didn't the king make some kind of law?

Puppet Two: Yeah, like (using manly voice), "No one can pray to any god except for the king."

Teacher: That's right. Some men who were jealous of Daniel tricked King Darius into making this law.

Puppet One: How come Daniel didn't obey the law?

Teacher: If Daniel obeyed this new law, then he'd have to pray to the king instead of God. But that

would be disobeying God's law. Only God is worthy of our prayers and worship.

Puppet Two: So it was more important for Daniel to obey God instead of obeying a law that was wrong?

Teacher: Yes. So Daniel bowed down and prayed like usual.

Puppet One: That's when the spies caught him.

Puppet Two: Yeah, the jealous guys saw him praying and turned him in.

Teacher: And the punishment was to be thrown into a den of fierce, hungry lions.

Puppet One: So Daniel could've been eaten by the lions?

Puppet Two: Rooaarr! Rooaarr! Gulp!

Teacher: Yes, those lions usually ate anyone that was thrown in there. But God was in control of the

whole thing. He sent an angel to the lions' den and shut the lions' mouths.

Puppet Two: Wow! But why did God let Daniel go there in the first place?

Puppet One: Maybe he wanted to show that he's in control of the lions.

Teacher: Actually, God did use this situation to show his power to King Darius. When the king saw

how God kept Daniel safe, he believed Daniel's God was the true God.

Puppet Two: Neat! Did God do that with any other king?

Puppet One: What about the king that saw the hand?

Teacher: Oh, yes! King Belshazzar was a very proud man. And God was going to punish him for his

sinful pride.

Puppet One: So he made a hand appear out of nowhere and start writing words on the wall. Oooh!

(shudders)

Puppet Two: That sounds creepy. I'd run away if I saw something like that.

Puppet One: Well, it sure scared Belshazzar!

Teacher: God was sending Belshazzar a message that he would be punished.

Puppet One: And he died that same night.

Puppet Two: So God showed he was in control even over the king?

Teacher: Yes. God also showed King Nebuchadnezzar his power and control.

Puppet One: You mean, when he threw those three guys into the furnace?

Puppet Two: Oh, I know this . . . Sadshack, Meshrack, and Adingo. Wait, no . . . Shadrash, Mishmash . . .

Teacher: You mean Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego.

Puppet Two: Yeah, them. They didn't want to worship a statue, so the king threw them into the fiery

furnace.

Puppet One: They wanted to worship only God. And God kept them safe in the fire.

Teacher: God showed many kings and other people, like the people of Judah, that he is in control

over everything and over everyone.

Puppet One: That's why we should worship only him, right? Because he is in control over everything.

Teacher: Yes. God is sovereign. He's the only one who is worthy of worship and praise.

Puppet Two: That's a good thing to remember, to worship and praise only God.

Puppet One: And trust him because he is in control.

Teacher: Yes, those are great things to remember. But I guess it's time to say goodbye.

Puppet One/Two: Okay. Thanks and goodbye! (Puppet Two makes roaring noises as he leaves.)
