



1 Samuel 21:12–13, 24:4, chapter 26





% What You Heard In the Word

- Because Saul was jealous, he hunted David, trying to kill him. But God protected David and his men.
- When David had the chance to take revenge on King Saul, he chose to show mercy instead.

Ask your child these questions from today's lesson:

- 1. What did David do to escape the Philistine city? He acted like a crazy man.
- 2. Instead of taking revenge, what did David do when Saul came into the cave? Cut off a piece of Saul's robe.
- 3. Instead of taking revenge, what did David do when he sneaked into Saul's camp? *Took Saul's spear and water jar.*
