

What You Heard *In the Word*

- The Ten Commandments tell us how to respect God and treat others.
- The Ten Commandments show us our sin and need for a Savior—Jesus.

OutWord *For Family Discussion*

Suppose a friend says to you, “I don’t think God would punish me. I’m sure that I’ll go to heaven when I die. I haven’t done anything terrible, like kill someone!” **What could you say to her?**

Most people haven’t committed a sin like murder, but it’s wrong to compare ourselves to others to determine what sin is. Instead, we should see what God calls sin in the Bible. He gave Ten Commandments that show how he wants us to live. These commands include putting God first, speaking his name with respect, obeying our parents, telling the truth, and being content with the things we have. God says in his Word that when we break even one of the commandments it is as though we have broken all of them. If we’re honest, we’ve all broken one or more of these commands. How many times have you disobeyed your parents, lied, or wanted something that someone else has? God’s laws show us that we all sin. It doesn’t matter if we’re breaking different commands than someone else; the point is that we’re all guilty of breaking God’s command to be holy. That’s why God sent his Son, Jesus, to die and take the punishment for our sins. If we could be good enough, he wouldn’t have sent Jesus to die.
