Burning Bush Craft

Materials

Burning Bush sheet for each student (following page)
Colored tissue paper (yellow, orange, and red)
Crayons or markers
Liquid glue
Optional: bowls, paint brushes, or cotton swabs for



Instructions

sharing glue

Print one Burning Bush sheet for each student. Have students spread glue onto one section of the bush outline at a time. Tear tissue paper into small pieces and roll them into wads. Place the wads close together onto the glued section. Continue using all three colors of tissue paper until all the sections are filled. Color the trunk of the bush and Moses with crayons or markers.

Suggested Discussion

- ? We all know that fire will burn a bush. But the bush Moses saw didn't burn up into ashes. Does that mean the bush was special, or was God doing something miraculous? God was doing a miracle.
- **?** God used that bush to get Moses' attention. Did it work? Yes.

Yes. It did. Moses was leading the sheep, but when he saw this strange sight, he turned away from the sheep and went to the bush. And that's where God spoke to Moses and told him to do something very different from what he had been doing for the last 40 years in the desert.

Sometimes God calls us to do something we've never done before. We might feel like there's no way we can do it. But God never intends for us to do things all by ourselves. He will always help us do the tasks he gives us.
