

What You Heard In the Word

- The Israelites grew impatient waiting for Moses to return from Mount Sinai and worshipped a golden calf that Aaron made.
- God was ready to destroy the Israelites because of their sin. But when Moses prayed, God showed mercy.

Ask your child these questions from today's lesson:

- 1. What two commandments did the Israelites disobey? #1—to put God first and #2—to worship only God.
- 2. What did the Israelites tell Aaron to do? *Make an idol for them to worship.*
- 3. Did God wipe out the Israelites the way they deserved, or did he have mercy on them? He had mercy on them.
