- 1. How long did God say Judah's captivity in Babylon would last: 7, 70, or 700 years? 70 years.
- 2. Which prophet recorded God's promise of the new covenant? Jeremiah.
- 3. Who did God make the old covenant with? The Israelites.
- 4. What was the old covenant of the Ten Commandments written on? Stone tablets.
- 5. Where would the new covenant be written? On people's hearts, scrolls, or doorposts? People's hearts.
- 6. The old covenant included many what that were impossible for the people to keep perfectly? Laws.
- 7. Why is it impossible for people to keep all of God's laws and commands? We are sinners.
- 8. As part of the new covenant, God promised that he would forgive the people's iniquity and remember their what no more? Sin.
- 9. Who did God send to take the punishment of sin and offer complete forgiveness? His Son, Jesus.
- 10. Ephesians describes the salvation offered through Jesus as a gift, a competition, or a law? Gift.
- 11. Why was Jesus the only one who could die in our place? Jesus was perfect, without sin.
- 12. Under the old covenant, what had to be sacrificed over and over to cover sin? Animals.
- 13. Who sacrificed the animals: fathers, priests, or kings? Priests.
- **14.** Why weren't the animal sacrifices enough to offer complete forgiveness? They just covered sin; they couldn't take it away. They weren't the perfect sacrifice.
- 15. What title does Hebrews 9 give to Jesus: high king, high priest, or perfect prophet? High priest.
- **16.** Why is Jesus called our high priest? Because he made the one perfect and final sacrifice for sin when he died on the cross and then rose again to conquer death.
- 17. What did Jesus shed for us on the cross? His own blood.
- **18.** What is wrong with people thinking they can be good enough to get to heaven? They are trying to get to heaven on their own. They are ignoring what the Bible says is the only way to be saved—through faith in Jesus and turning from sin.
- **19. Why is the new covenant better than the old covenant?** The new covenant through Jesus offers complete forgiveness of sins and the promise of eternal life in heaven for those who trust in Jesus and turn from their sins. The old covenant was a system of repeated sacrificing that never took away sin; it only covered it.
- 20. Is our memory verse, 1 Peter 5:10, speaking to God's children (Christians) or people who haven't trusted in Jesus (non-Christians)? *God's children; Christians*.
