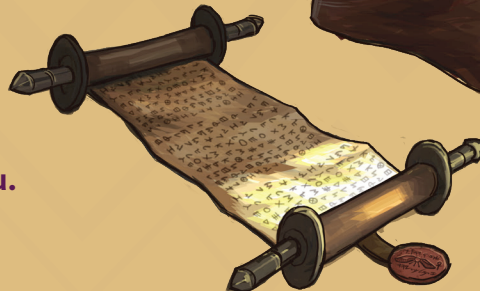

- God heard Hezekiah's prayer and answered in a mighty way! The angel of the Lord destroyed many Assyrian soldiers during the night, forcing King Sennacherib to return home.

OutWord *For Family Discussion*

What if your friend says he doesn't believe that God answers prayer because he didn't answer his? **What could you say?**

God tells us how to pray in the Bible. I don't think he would do that if he wasn't going to listen and answer. If we are Christians, God will always answer. It's just that his answers aren't always what we think they should be. Sometimes he answers right away and says yes! Sometimes his answer is no. And sometimes he answers years later in an unexpected way or in a way we'll never know about. Praying takes a lot of faith in God, but God is always faithful. God wants us to trust him and keep praying. Then when he answers, we should give him the praise and glory for what he does.
