Silent Ball

Materials

☐ One medium-size ball

Instructions

Have students stand or sit in a circle. Without making any noise, students will quickly pass the ball by tossing or rolling it to someone else in the circle. Once a student has the ball, he must pass it on as quickly as possible.

Students may use facial expressions or signs, such as pointing, to show whom they have chosen to catch the ball. Anyone who speaks, laughs, or makes any other noise is out of the game. The last person left is the winner.

Suggested Discussion

In this game, you had to keep silent. But you were still able to let your friends know with your face and with hand motions that you were passing the ball.

But God still spoke to his people through his written Word. The people could read God's laws and know how to obey him.
