- 1. Who became the king of Israel after Saul and his sons died? David.
- 2. What holy object did David want to bring to Jerusalem, his capital city? *Ark of God, ark of the covenant.*
- 3. What did the ark of the covenant look like? Gold-covered box with cherubim (angels) and a mercy seat.
- **4.** What did the ark represent? The presence of God.
- 5. Who had captured the ark of God during the time of Eli and Samuel? The Philistines.
- 6. Why did the Philistines decide they didn't want to keep the ark anymore? God sent plagues (tumors) and fear upon them because of the ark.
- 7. How did the Philistines return the ark of God to Israel? They put it on a cart pulled by milk cows.
- **8.** How did the Philistines know that God was responsible for their plagues? The cows pulling the ark of God went straight up the road to an Israelite city.
- 9. When David and the people went to get the ark from Kiriath-jearim, how did they move the ark? What did they put it on? A new cart pulled by oxen.

- **14.** Where was the ark placed in Jerusalem? A tent David had pitched for it.
- 15. What did David decide he wanted to do for the ark of God? Build a permanent house for it, a temple.
- 16. What prophet brought God's message to David? Nathan.
- 17. Who did Nathan the prophet say would build the temple? One of David's sons.
- **18. What promise did God give to David?** The promise of the Messiah, a great king and Savior, who would come from his offspring/descendants.
