## Tic-Tac-Know

## **Materials**

Commandment Illustrations (following pages)
Masking tape
Two colors of beanbags or rolled up socks, about six for each team

## **Instructions**

Print the Commandment Illustrations. Create a tic-tac-toe grid (three by three) on the floor using masking tape. Make each square large enough for an illustration. Place nine illustrations face up in the grid. Make a tossing line a few feet away from the grid.

Divide class into two teams and have them line up behind the tossing line. Teams will take turns tossing a beanbag onto the illustrations in the grid. If they can name the commandment correctly, their beanbag stays. Correct answers may be exact or paraphrased wording of the actual commandment from Exodus 20 or the text from the Lesson Illustrations. Next team's turn. If a team misses the grid or answers incorrectly, play goes to the other team. The first team to get three beanbags in a row in the grid wins.

Change the order of the illustrations (adding the one left out in the first round) and play again as time allows.

## **Suggested Discussion**

This game tested how well you know the Ten Commandments! God gave the Ten Commandments so we would know how to honor him and treat others.

- ? Can anyone keep all these commands? No.
- **?** Because we can't perfectly keep these commands, what do they teach us? That we are sinners and need a Savior.


