

# Review Questions

1. What book of history in the Bible did we read from today? *2 Kings.*
2. What was the name of the northern kingdom? *Israel.*
3. What prophets had God sent to warn Israel? *Amos, Hosea.*
4. How many years had God been patient, waiting for Israel to repent: 100, 250, or 500? *250 years.*
5. What enemy did God bring to invade Israel? *Assyrians.*
6. What capital city of Israel did the Assyrians besiege? *Samaria.*
7. What is a siege? *When an enemy surrounds a city, cutting off supplies, and waits for the people inside to surrender.*
8. How long did the siege of Samaria last: three days, three months, or three years? *Three years.*
9. What was the name of the king of Assyria who invaded Israel? *Shalmaneser.*
10. What did the Assyrians do to the people of Israel after they were defeated? *Took them away to live in Assyrian/foreign cities.*
11. Who came to live in Israel once the people were exiled? *Assyrians and people from foreign nations.*
12. Why was God angry with Israel? *They sinned by worshipping false gods/idols.*
13. Who did the Israelites refuse to listen to? *Prophets, seers.*
14. What message had the prophets given the people of Israel? *Warned them of their sin and the coming punishment from God.*
15. How did the Israelites know what God expected of them? What had God given them? *The Ten Commandments; his laws.*
16. How did God feel when his people stubbornly refused to listen, repent, and obey? *Angry.*
17. Which attribute of God means he cannot sin and hates sin? *Holy.*
18. Which attribute of God means he must punish sin? *Just.*
19. How had God shown mercy to Israel? *He sent prophets to warn them. He gave them 250 years to repent.*
20. How has God shown mercy to all sinners? *He sent Jesus to earth to die on the cross, taking the punishment of sin for those who believe in him.*
21. How do we receive the gift of salvation? *Turn from our sins, ask God for forgiveness, and trust in Jesus alone.*
22. Who can fill in the missing words from the memory verse? *Read the verse, pausing before several words to let a student say the word that comes next. Proverbs 3:11–12 My son, do not \_\_\_\_\_ (despise) the LORD's discipline or be \_\_\_\_\_ (weary) of his reproof, for the LORD \_\_\_\_\_ (reproves) him whom he loves, as a \_\_\_\_\_ (father) the son in whom he delights. (ESV)*
