Review Questions

Lesson 111

- 1. Which Jewish priest living in Babylon was given a vision of God's glory? *Ezekiel*.
- 2. What prophet of God saw a vision of the Lord on his throne? *Isaiah*.
- 3. What did Isaiah say when he was overwhelmed by his sin in the presence of the holy God: "Great is the Lord," "I'm done for," or "Woe is me"? "Woe is me."
- 4. In Isaiah's vision, what attribute of God were the seraphim praising: holiness, faithfulness, or omnipotence? *Holiness*.
- 5. Who did the Apostle John see in his vision of heaven: God, seraphim, or Jesus? Jesus, the Son of Man.

Lesson 112

- 6. To which prophet did God give the message about the new covenant: Isaiah, Jeremiah, or Malachi? *Jeremiah*.
- 7. What did the priests have to offer over and over to cover people's sins in the old covenant? *Animal sacrifices*.
- 8. What was impossible for the people under the old covenant to keep? The laws of God, the Ten Commandments.
- 9. Instead of requiring animal sacrifices to be made over and over, what did God promise in the new covenant? One perfect sacrifice for the forgiveness of sin, Jesus.
- **10.** Why don't we have to work to earn forgiveness? Salvation through Jesus is a gift of God received by grace through faith.

Lesson 113

- 11. Which Persian king allowed the first group of Jews to return to Judah: Ahasuerus, Artaxerxes, or Cyrus? *Cyrus*.
- 12. Who led the first group of exiles back to Jerusalem? *Zerubbabel*.

- 13. What did Zerubbabel and the Jews rebuild in Jerusalem: the palace, the temple, or the city walls? *The temple*.
- 14. How long did it take the Jews to finish the temple because of opposition by their enemies: 10 years, 21 years, or 41 years? 21 years.
- 15. What promise of God was fulfilled when King Cyrus said the Jews could return to Jerusalem? *That their captivity would be 70 years.*

Lesson 114

- 16. Who did God choose to become queen of Persia? *Esther*.
- 17. Who was Esther's cousin? Mordecai.
- **18. Why did Haman hate the Jews?** *Because Mordecai refused to bow to him.*
- 19. How did Esther show courage and faith in God? She went before the king without permission to plead for the lives of her people. She asked her people to fast for her.
- 20. How did God use Esther and Mordecai to save the Jews from Haman's plot? (Ask several students.) As queen, Esther could go before the king. Esther invited the king and Haman to two banquets and revealed that she was a Jew. Mordecai had saved the king's life. The king was angry when he realized Haman sought to kill his queen and her people. Mordecai and Esther wrote a law to allow the Jews to defend themselves from their enemies.

Lesson 115

- 21. What priest led the second group of Jews back to Judah during the reign of King Artaxerxes? *Ezra*.
- **22.** What did Ezra want to teach the people? *The law of God.*
- 23. When Ezra got to Jerusalem, what sin had the Jews there committed? They married foreign (non-Jewish) people who led them to worship their false gods.

24. When Ezra wept and prayed to confess their sin, how did the people respond? They wept and repented (turned from their sin by separating themselves from their foreign family members).

Lesson 116

- 25. Who led the third group of Jews back to Judah? *Nehemiah.*
- 26. Which king gave Nehemiah permission to return to Jerusalem to rebuild the walls of the city: Ahasuerus, Artaxerxes, or Cyrus? *Artaxerxes*.
- 27. Name one of the enemies of Nehemiah and the Jews who didn't want them to rebuild the walls. Sanballat, Tobiah, Geshem.
- 28. How did Nehemiah show faith and action when his enemies threatened to attack? He prayed, and he armed the Jews with weapons. He set up a trumpet call to alert the people and bring them together if an attack came.

Lesson 117

- 29. What other ways did Nehemiah's enemies try to stop the work of the walls and to discredit him as governor? (Ask several students.) They sent messengers to ask Nehemiah to come meet with them. They sent threatening letters. They tried to make him afraid and go hide in the temple.
- 30. What were some wealthy Jews doing to their own people? Taking their food, land, houses, and money; forcing some to sell their children into slavery; charging interest on their debts.
- 31. How did the wealthy Jews respond when Nehemiah confronted them with their sin? They repented and promised to return what they had taken.
- **32.** How did Nehemiah help teach the people the Word of God? He gathered the people together and had Ezra read the law of God and the Levites explain it.

Lesson 118

33. What is the last book in the Old Testament? *Malachi*.

- 34. What was Malachi's message of warning about? The priests (and people) were offering imperfect animals (blind, lame, sick) to God as sacrifices.
- 35. Why was offering imperfect animals wrong?

 God had clearly commanded the people to offer perfect (unblemished) animals, the best of their flock.
- 36. In Malachi's prophecy, who would come to prepare the way for the Messiah: a messenger, a priest, or a king? A messenger.
- 37. Who was the messenger God sent to prepare the way for Jesus? *John the Baptist.*
- 38. Who announced the coming of the messenger to Zechariah? *The angel Gabriel.*

Lesson 119

- 39. How many years passed between Malachi's prophecies and the coming of Jesus to start the New Testament? 400 years.
- 40. Why are the 400 years between the Old and New Testaments sometimes called the "silent years"? Because there was no new word from God during those years.
- 41. To whom did God give visions of the future using a ram and a goat? *Daniel*.
- 42. Who conquered the known world and spread the Greek language? *Alexander the Great.*
- 43. Which Jewish group wanted to work with the Greeks to prosper the Jews? *Sadducees*.
- 44. Which Jewish group made up extra laws to add to God's laws? *Pharisees*.
- 45. Who conquered the Jews and connected the world with improved roads and travel? *Rome*.
- 46. How did God use the Greeks and Romans to prepare the world for Jesus and the spread of the gospel? There was a common language, Greek, used for the Bible. There was improved travel for the followers of Jesus to spread the gospel after his death and resurrection.
- **47.** Why were the 400 years not really "silent"? God had given his Word in the Old Testament to lead and guide his people.
