Review Questions

- 1. Why can we always trust the prophecies in the Bible but not the weather forecast? The prophets got their information from God. God told them what to write. Forecasters use human knowledge, which isn't always right.
- 2. Which attribute of God means that God knows everything, even the future: omnipotent, omnipresent, or omniscient? *Omniscient*.
- 3. Which two prophets did we read about today? Micah and Isaiah.
- **4.** When Micah wrote about the one who would be ruler in Israel, who was he talking about? *The Messiah, Jesus Christ.*
- 5. Messiah means "anointed one," which means the one who is *what*: chosen by God, remembered by God, or chosen by kings? *Chosen by God.*
- 6. Where did Micah prophesy that Jesus would be born? Bethlehem.
- 7. Micah wrote that the ruler's "coming forth is from of old, from ancient days." This description means that Jesus is eternal; he has no what? *Beginning or end*.
- 8. Who does John say was in the beginning with God? The Word/Jesus.
- 9. God promised that he would cast our sins into the depths of the what? Sea.
- 10. How did Jesus bear our sins for us? On his own body/on the cross.
- 11. According to Isaiah, the Lord would give the people what sign that the Messiah had come: a son would be born, a tree would grow, or many people would visit Bethlehem? A son would be born.
- 12. What name did Isaiah say the Messiah would be called: David, Immanuel, or Ephrathah? Immanuel.
- 13. What does Immanuel mean: God hears us, God knows us, or God with us? God with us.
- 14. Just as Micah and Isaiah wrote, Jesus was born in Bethlehem to a virgin. What was her name? Mary.
- 15. What did the angel tell Joseph that Mary's son would do? Save his people from their sins.
- 16. How did Isaiah say Jesus would be led to his death: like a harmless lamb, like a roaring lion, or like a fighting tiger? Like a harmless lamb.
- 17. How do we know the prophecies about Jesus' death actually happened? Where can we read about his death on the cross? In all four Gospels—Matthew, Mark, Luke, John.
- 18. Why did Jesus suffer and die for us? To forgive us of our sins/to save us from sin.
- **19.** What is the reference of our memory verse? *Ephesians 2:4–5.*
