Puppet Review Script

Puppet One: Hi, everyone! It's time for you to review your lessons, right?

Teacher or Students: Yes, it is!

Puppet Two: Hooray! I can't wait to hear what you've been learning about.

Teacher: Zerubbabel led the Jews to rebuild the temple of God in the city of Jerusalem.

Puppet Two: That would be a big job!

Teacher: Yes. First, they fixed up the altar so they could offer sacrifices to God. Then they laid the

foundation for the temple.

Puppet One: Isn't the foundation the flat part that goes on the ground first?

Puppet Two: It's supposed to make the building straight and strong, right?

Teacher: Yep. But there were some people who were living in Judah while the Jews were gone, and

they didn't like them coming back and building again.

Puppet One: Uh oh. Did they knock it down?

Teacher: No, but they did scare the Jews and made them quit building.

Puppet Two: That's not good.

Puppet One: Did they ever finish the temple?

Teacher: Oh yes! Twenty-one years later, they finished building after God caused a new king to command them to finish.

Puppet One: Wow! That took a long time. But God made sure it got done.

Puppet Two: Who led the second group home?

Teacher: A priest named Ezra led them home. But he found out that the people who had come earlier with Zerubbabel were disobeying God.

Puppet One: What did he do about it?

Puppet Two: He prayed about it, right?

Teacher: Right. When the people heard Ezra praying and crying about the things they were doing wrong, they understood their sin and wanted to make things right.

Puppet One: What about the third group?

Teacher: They went home to build the wall around Jerusalem.

Puppet Two: Oh, I heard about this! Nehemiah was their leader. But there were bad guys who planned to attack everyone while they were working.

Teacher: The bad guys bothered Nehemiah a lot because they didn't want the Jews to rebuild their wall and become a strong city.

Puppet One: So, what did they do?

Puppet Two: I know! (jumping up and down excitedly) I remember! They got all kinds of weapons, like guns and cannons and things—kaboom!

Puppet One: What?! They didn't have cannons in those days, Silly.

Teacher: That's true. They didn't have those kinds of weapons, but they did have spears, swords, and shields. So Nehemiah told the people to keep working but to be ready in case the enemy tried to sneak up on them.

Puppet Two: Didn't some of the workers carry their swords with them?

Students: Faithful!

Teacher: That's right. God is sovereign and faithful.
