

# Review Questions

1. What great catastrophe have we been talking about? *The flood of Noah's day.*
2. What did God tell Noah to build to save him, his family, and many animals from the flood? *An ark.*
3. What was the ark made out of? *Gopher wood.*
4. How tall was the ark? How many stories high was it? *51 feet—almost five stories high.*
5. If Noah had school buses at the time, how many could he have fit in the ark? *480!*
6. What is a cubit? *Ancient form of measurement—about 20 inches. The distance from the elbow of a man to the tips of his fingers.*
7. God knew what was going to happen and what Noah would need. Which attribute talks about God knowing everything—past, present, and future? *Omniscient.*
8. How do we know God did not tell Noah to build an ark like the cute little toy arks we see in books or in a store? *God knew what kind of ship Noah needed. Those cute ones could never have survived the flood. That is NOT what God's Word says the ark looked like.*
9. Describe what kind of time this catastrophe really was? *Serious, dangerous, scary, a time of judgment. Not fun.*
10. Why did God bring male and female animals to the ark? *Because God wanted them to have babies and fill the earth again after the flood.*
11. God didn't need to bring every different animal we know of to the ark. He only needed to bring two of each according to their what? *Kind.*
12. How many "clean" animals did Noah bring onto the ark? *Seven pairs of each kind.*
13. About how many animals were on the ark? *Around 7,000.*
14. There is one land animal many people don't believe could have been on the ark. What is it? *Dinosaurs.*
15. How do we know dinosaurs were on the ark? What does the Bible say? *Dinosaurs were land animals created on day six. God sent EVERY kind of land animal to the ark.*
16. How could dinosaurs fit on the ark? *God could have sent young ones to the ark. Many were about the size of a sheep.*
17. Can you say the memory verse we have been working on? *Allow several students to say the verse.*
