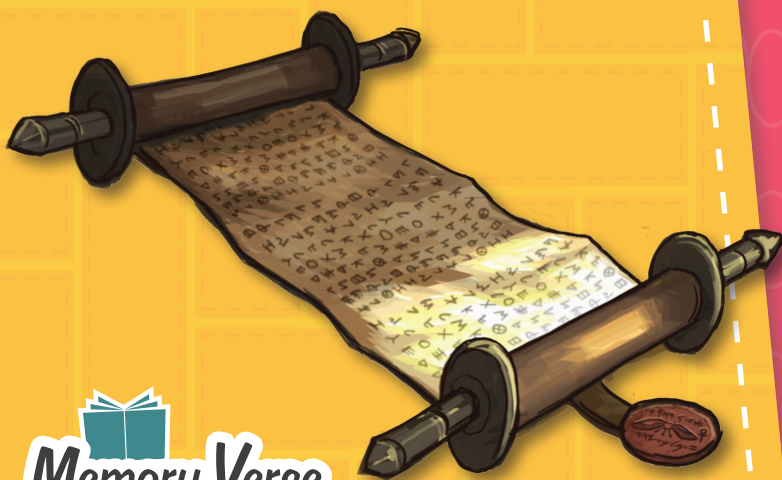


What You Heard *In the Word*

- Hezekiah was a good king of Judah. He trusted and obeyed God for his whole life.
- When the enemy came with a frightening message and a troublesome letter, Hezekiah took the problem straight to God.

Ask your child these questions from today's lesson:

1. Who were the Assyrians? *A powerful enemy that wanted to take over Judah.*
2. Who did Hezekiah trust to help him against the Assyrians? *He trusted God.*
3. What did God do to the Assyrian army? *He wiped out 185,000 soldiers in one night so the army and their king had to leave.*
