
## Treasure Hunt Game

## **Materials**

- ☐ Game board pieces (following pages)
- ☐ Number cards (following pages) printed on card stock
- ☐ Large construction paper or two small sheets taped together for each student
- ☐ Crayons, colored pencils, or markers
- ☐ Glue
- ☐ Scissors




## **Instructions**

Print one set of game board pieces and two sets of number cards (on card stock) for each student. Pass out one piece of large construction paper (or two small pieces taped together) to each student for their game board. Have students color the game pieces they want to use, cut each piece out, and glue them onto the construction paper to design their own game path (be sure each game board starts with the Bible and finishes with the treasure chest). Remind students that they can cut some paths apart to make smaller paths or to turn the curves in different directions. Next, color and add decorations. Have students cut out their number cards.

To play, use one jewel-shaped marker for each player. Place markers at the start of the game board and take turns drawing number cards one at a time to move along the path according to the number shown on the card. Follow any directions on the spaces. The first player to reach the finish wins.


## **Suggested Discussion**
