## **Review Questions**

- 1. What did God expect from the Israelites when they settled in the promised land? Obedience to him and his commands.
- 2. What were the Baals? False gods, idols.
- 3. Who taught the Israelites about the Baals? Canaanites, people in the land.
- 4. How did God feel when his people worshipped false gods instead of him? *Angry.*
- 5. How did God punish the Israelites when they disobeyed in the book of Judges? Sent enemies against them.
- **6. Enemy nations would oppress the Israelites. What does oppress mean?** *Using power and authority to treat others harshly or with cruelty.*
- 7. Why did God send punishment? What did he want the people to do? Recognize they had sinned and repent.
- 8. When the Israelites cried out to the Lord because of their enemies, what would he do? Raise up a judge to deliver them.
- 9. Were the judges in the Bible more like military leaders or like courtroom judges? Military leaders.
- **10.** Who was the first judge God raised up to save the people when they were oppressed? He was Caleb's nephew. Othniel.
- 11. After God gave the judges victory, what did the people enjoy? It's the fifth step of the cycle. *Peace and rest.*
- 12. About how many years did Israel repeat the cycle in Judges? 300.
- 13. What is idolatry? Putting anything in our lives above God.
- **14. What did Jesus ask the young ruler to do?** *Sell all his possessions and give to the poor and then follow him.*
- 15. How did the young ruler feel when he heard this? Sad.
- 16. What was the young ruler's idol—the thing he loved more than Jesus? Riches.
- **17. Give an example of an idol we may have today.** Allow several students to answer. Answers will vary but may include watching TV, playing sports or video games, being good at playing an instrument, texting friends, shopping, etc.
- 18. Which of the Ten Commandments are we breaking when we don't put God first and have an idol in our lives? First: You shall have no gods before me. Second: You shall not make for yourselves an idol.
- 19. What attributes of God do we see in the cycle of Israel's disobedience and God's help in the book of Judges? Allow several students to answer. Just, holy, merciful, faithful.
- **20.** Who can recite the memory verse? Allow several students to recite the verse.
