Instructions

Print one Match the Step worksheet for each student. Keep the answer key for your use.

Tell students that they will be looking up the verses in Judges and then matching them to a step in the Judges cycle at the top of the page. They will write the number of the step next to the references.

You may want to make this activity a race or allow students to work in pairs or teams with each group assigned to a few references each.

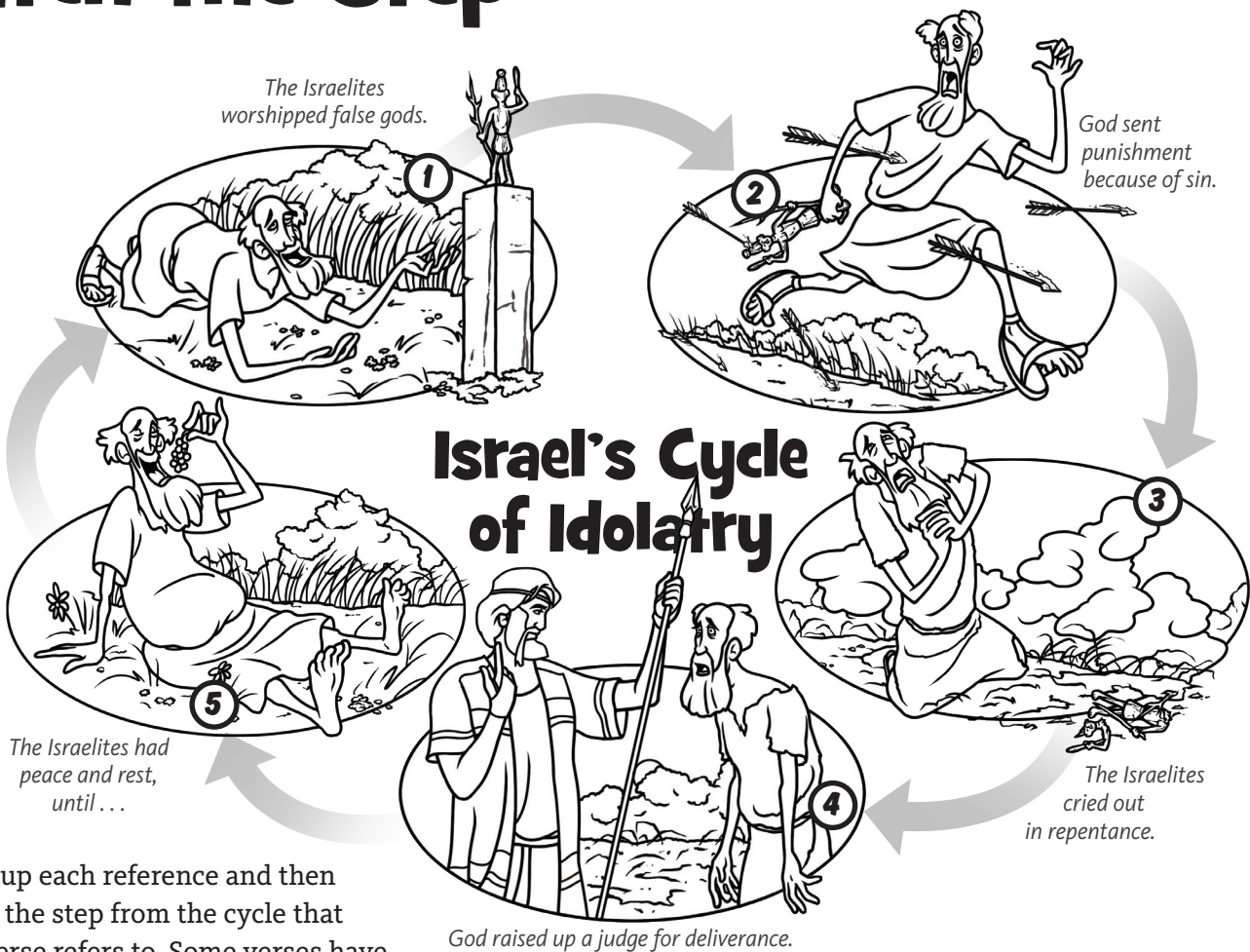
Review answers when everyone has finished.

Refer to the cycle picture on the worksheet. The Israelites repeated the five steps in this cycle for about 300 years. Even though they kept disobeying God and turning to idols, God was faithful to deliver them when they cried for help. He sent judges to lead the Israelites to victory over their enemies.

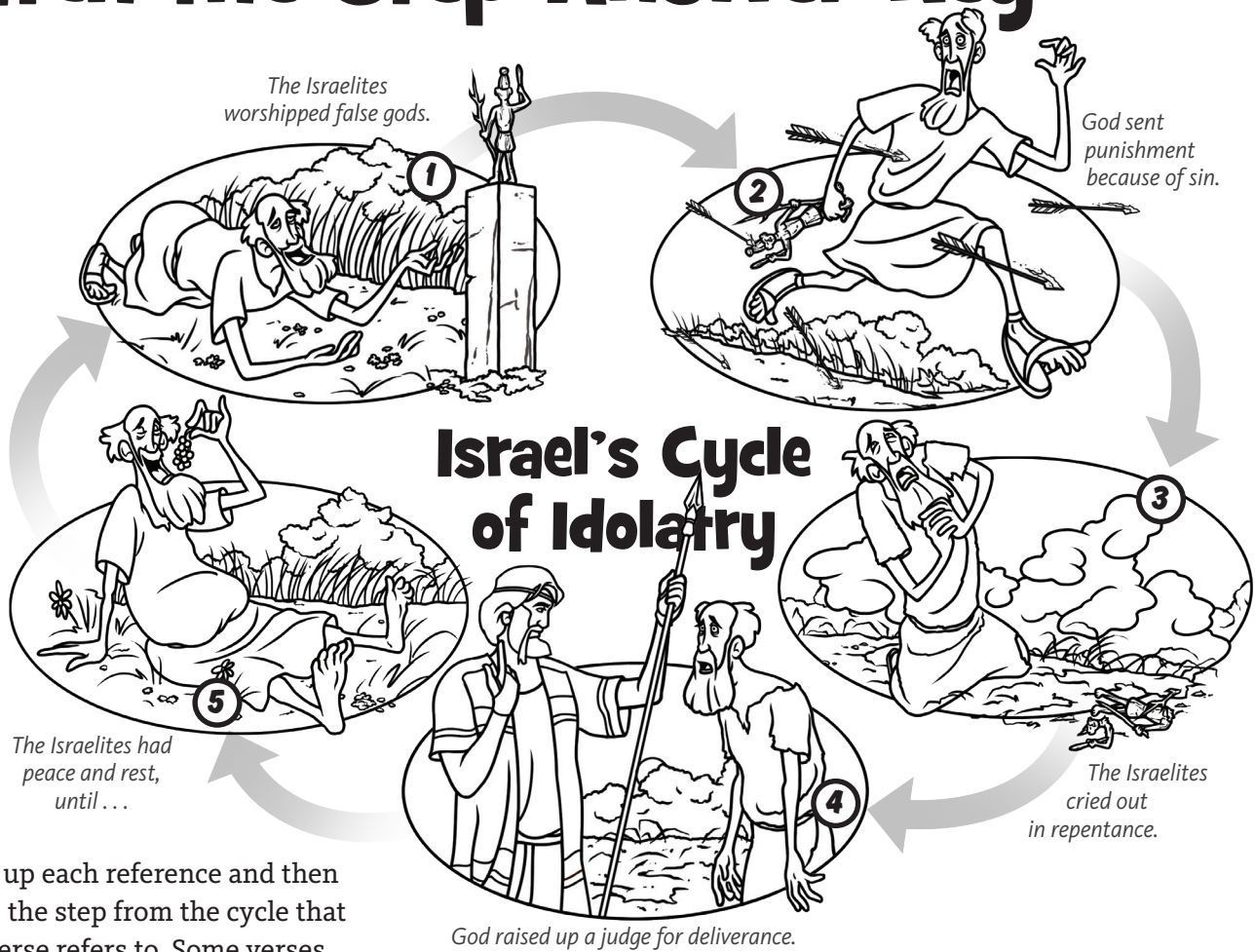
