Donkey Puppet


Materials

One set of Puppet Pieces for each student (following pages)
Paper lunch bags
Glue
Black, gray, or brown yarn cut into 3-inch lengths
Crayons or markers
Scissors
Optional: 1-inch plastic wiggle eyes or buttons

Instructions

Print and cut out one set of Puppet Pieces (eyes, ears, nose, mouth) for each student, or have them do the cutting. Have students color each piece. (You may want to use wiggle eyes instead of the paper eyes.)

Have students lay their paper bag flat with the flap facing up. Have students spread glue on the top of the nose and position it about a ½ inch over the edge of the flap. Next, help students lift the flap and glue the mouth underneath, lining up the top edge with the crease under the flap. Have students glue on the eyes and ears.



Allow glue to dry before using the puppets.

Suggested Discussion
