Ask your child these questions from today's lesson:

- 1. Was it okay for Saul to offer a sacrifice instead of waiting for Samuel? *No*.
- 2. What did Saul keep alive when he should have destroyed all the Amalekites and all their things? He kept King Agag and some animals alive.
- 3. What is a consequence? Something bad that happens because of a bad choice.
