Crazy Shoe Scramble

Materials

☐ One large laundry basket or bin (or more if you have a large class)

Instructions

Divide class into relay teams. Use tape to mark a start line for the teams and place the laundry basket/bin on the other side of the room. Note: If you don't have a laundry basket/bin, have students create a pile of shoes in a particular spot.

Have teams take turns running to the laundry basket/bin, removing ONE shoe and placing it in the basket/bin, and then running back to tag the next teammate. Students must wait until they reach the basket/bin before they can remove their shoe! Each student will run twice, depositing one shoe on each turn. The first team to have all members without shoes wins.

Run the relay again, this time having students retrieve their shoes, one at a time, from the laundry basket/bin (they'll have to do some digging!). Students must put their shoe ON before running back to tag the next teammate. The first team to have all members with their shoes on their feet wins.

Suggested Discussion

We had fun racing around with our shoes today, but it was serious when God told Moses to remove his sandals.

? Why did God tell Moses to remove his sandals when he approached the burning bush? Because the place where he stood was holy ground.

Yes. The ground around the burning bush was holy because God was there! That made Moses hide his face in fear because he had a proper reverence for God's power and holiness.

When we come to God in prayer, through Bible reading, or at church to worship, we must remember who God is—all-powerful, holy, and mighty—and be humble and obedient before him.
