King of Kings Crown

Materials

Crown Pattern for each student (next page)
Foil sheets (at least 8 x 11 inches)
Foam sheets cut to 5½ x 8½ inches
Scissors
Markers (permanent work best)
Jewel stickers
Ballpoint pens for each student
Tape
Optional: paper clips and glue or self- adhesive magnets



Instructions

Print one Crown Pattern for each student. Have students cut out the pattern then trace around it on the foam. Cut out a crown from the foam.

Next, lay the foam crown on the foil sheet and trace around it, leaving about an inch around the edges. Cut out the foil on the traced line. Center the foam on the dull side of the cut foil. Fold the foil over the edges of the foam to secure it, clipping the foil at the two inside angles for easier folding. Pinch and fold any extra foil toward the backside of the crown. Use tape to secure the foil edges on the back of the foam.

Turn the crown over and place the paper pattern on top. Use a ballpoint pen to trace over the words and add designs, **pressing gently, being careful not to tear the foil beneath.** Once their designs are finished, have students decorate the crown with jewel stickers and markers, again being careful not to tear the foil.

Optional: glue a paper clip to the back for a hanger loop or attach a magnet.

Suggested Discussion

God promised David that the King of kings, the Savior, would come from his descendants. This was a promise about Jesus! He is the one who will reign forever as the Prince of Peace.
